The Watergate Special Prosecution Force (WSPF) and Office of Counsel to the President furnished information to this Bureau on August 11 and 13, 1974, respectively, alleging that one Hal O'Brien of Washington, D.C., possessed knowledge of information detrimental to Governor Nelson Rockefeller. Harold Johnson O'Brien, who was identified and located by the FBI, related to the WSPF on August 12, 1974, that Roy Sheppard told O'Brien he had lied to the grand jury in 1973, and that he had secreted in a safe deposit box in Pulaski, Virginia, under his sister's name, certain documents which belong to E. Howard Hunt. These documents allegedly state Rockefeller contributed funds to the McGovern Campaign and had hired thugs to disrupt th democratic convention if McGovern was not nominated.

Roy Sheppard testified in May 1973 before the Watergat-Grand Jury in connection with a report that he had removed sever: boxes of records from the Executive Office Building office of E. Howard Hunt on June 18, 1972.

FBI investigation identified the seven brothers and sisters of Sheppard and located two safe deposit boxes which are rented to members of Sheppard's family. Roy Sheppard and the safe deposit box holders denied knowledge of any such papers and a consent search of the boxes disclosed nothing beyond personal papers.

The WSPF is in possession of all details and is current deciding what, if any, further grand jury or investigative action is warranted.

Phila. Lawyer Tied To Rockefeller Smear

By FRANK DOUGHERTY

The mystery man who told White House officials that Nelson Rockefeller financed a team of men to disrupt the 1972 Democratic National Convention has been identified as Philadelphia attorney Haifiilton A. Long.

Long, who could not be reached for comment, maintains an office here in the Public Ledger Building, 6th and Chestnut sts.

The charges were dismissed as unfounded by Watergate special prosecutor Leon Jaworski after Long, believed to be in his 70s, contacted White House counsel Philip Buchen with the information,

DESCRIBED as an "eldc ly right-wing activist" by the tong Island paper, Newsday, Long said he made the allegations against the former New York governer "to avoid President Ford's being caught in an Eagleton Affair' like 1963."

The reference was to the decision by Democratic Presidential candidate George McGovern to drop Sen. Thomas Eagleton (D., Mo.) as his running mate after learning that Eagleton had undergone shock treatments for severe depression.

That incident took place in the 1972 race, however, not in 1968.

Long, who operates Your Heritage Books, Inc., and Foresight-Through-Hindsight Lectures, told Buchen that the proof could be found in documents formerly belonging to Watergate conspirator E. Howard Hunt that were being kept in a bank safe deposit box in Pulaski, Va.

The information about the documents was given to Hamilton by Harold (Hal) O'Brien, owner of a Washington photocopying shop.

AFTER AN investigation by Jaworski's office failed to turn up any evidence, includ-

ing opening the supposed hiding place of the documents and finding nothing, the charges were declared unfounded.

"I'm the guy who told Long about the documents," said O'Brien last night. "I threw the pass to Long."

O'Brien maintains that the documents do exist and they are being hidden by Roy Sheppard, an old friend of his that knew Howard Hunt.

Rockefeller Enemy. Upset by Publicity

Hamilton A. Long has only a small part in the events surrounding the transition from the Rixon Administration to the Ford Administration, and he says he's not happy with it.

He'd be much more satisfied, Long says, if he had no public part in the drama. Certainly he didn't expect to be revealed as the informant who told! White House Counsel Philip W. Buchen that the files

of Watergate burglar E. Howard Hunt Jr. contained evidence damaging to Nelson Rockefeller. The former govnor of New York is reported to be among President Ford's top candidates for the Vice Presidency.

"I taked in confidence with Mr. Buthen," Long said Monday in his office on the ninth floor of the Public Ledger Building, 6th and Walnut sts. "I assumed the confidence would be kept."

It wasn't.

Buchen notified the office of Special Watergate Prosecutor Leon Jaworski. A frantic search was made of boxes in a bank vault in Virginia; the boxes were empty. On Saturday, Presidential Press Secretary J. F. terHorst denounced the incident as the work of "extremists who wished for reasons of their own to discredit Governor Rockeleller."

Buchen named Long as the source of the tip. Leng passed the ball to H. J. O'Brien, a Washington printer, who said the information came from former White House staffer Roy Sheppard.

So Long claims his role was simply that of an intermediary.

Long seemed less distressed at being named the informant than at being called an "extremist."

Instead, he calls himself a "tiaditionalist." He says he is registered with neither pilitical party and in fact, seldom votes.

He is a tall, gracious man, a former Wall Street lawyer. Long's sandy hair and trim physicque belie the fact he is 75 years old.

He retired from active law practice in 1943 and since then has been an author. He has written only one book, "Your American Yardstick: The Twelve Basic American Principles."

Long published the book himself 11 years ago. Only 50,000 copies have been distributed, mostly through a company he formed for that purpose, and sales are very low.

Long said he was supported in his publishing firm by private individuals whom he declined to name. He also said he was not a member of any group or faction.

He travels much of the time, and his residence in Philadelphia is a hotel. His office, on the east side of the Public Ledger Building (the sign on the door says Your Heuitage Bock Co.), is his "head-quarters."

"This," said Long, sweeping his arm dramatically toward the toyer of Independence Hall, visible from his office window, "is why I'm here."

Ford to Choose 'Good President'

United Press International

WASHINGTON — President Ford said Monday his choice as a Vice President, likely to be announced today, will be first and foremost a person "who would be a good President."

Talking with reporters on Air Force 1 en route back to Washington from Chicago, the President turned aside all questions as to who is still in the running for the No. 2 job.

"I haven't told anybody," he said, "I'm a sphinx."

White House counselor Robert Hartman, who was aboard the plane, said the vice presidential nominee would definitely be a Republican.

Asked about the qualifications he was seeking, Ford said: "Naturally I think you have to take into consideration who would be a good President. And there is a broad parameter after that. I don't want to go beyond that."

Aides said Ford would announce his choice some time today; after pondering the matter since shortly after he was aworn in as President Aug. 1. They said the Fresident had narrowed his list of possibilities to "about half a dozen."

Asked whether allegations concerning Republican National, Chairman George Bush's 1970 senatorial cam-

paign had any impact on his candidacy for the post, Ford replied, "No more effect than the stories about Nelson Rockefeller."

Newsweek magazine reported Morday that Bush's chances had "slipped budly because of alleged irregularities in the financing of his 1970 Senate race in Texas." Texas Republican officials called that report "a lie."

A Philadelphia lawyer, Hamilton A. Long, called the White House last week alleging that Rockefeller had funded "dirty tricks" a med at disrupting the 1972 Dimocratic National Convertion. The White House replied, after investigations by the FBI and Special Prosecutor Leon Jaworski's office, that the accusations were groundless.

Vice President Choice May Come Tomorrow

Washington — (AP)—President Ford may end the vice presidential guessing game tomorrow.

Indications are he may choose someone other than the two front-runners in speculation, Nelson A. Rockefeller and George Bush.

Mr. Ford said on the way to play golf Sunday that he expects to decide on his vice presidential choice on Tuesday. Congressional confirmation hearings on the nominite won't start before mid-september.

Rockefeller is the only possibility Ford has publicly men-

He did so in a statement Saturday afternoon amid a furry of speculation surrounding what the White House said was an effort by right wing extremists" to smear the former New York governor and destroy his chances.

Press Is Told

President Ford has advised me that former governor. Rockefeller has been and remains under consideration for the vice presidential nomination," press secretary Jerald FigerHorst told reporters at the fourth press briefing of the day.

In New York today, Rockefeller today shrugged off an apparent attempt to discredit him by linking him to "dirty tricks" in the 1972 presidential campaign.

"I've been in politics a long time, so what's new?" Rockefeller replied to a reporter's questions as he arrived at his midtown office for a meeting of his Commission on Critical Choices for America.

He said he had spoken to President Ford on Saturday "and he told me what he was going to ded" before the White House announced that an in-

vestigation by the special Watergate prosecutor had concluded that the tip on the alleged link was baseless.

Speculation Shifts

However, two knowledgeable Capitol Hill Republican sources told The Associated Press that chances were growing that neither Rockefeller nor Bush, the Republican national chairman and top choice of many GOP conservatives, would be picked.

The sources said those in contention include NATO Ambassador Donald Runsfeld, a Ford intimate who has been working on the transition from the Nixon Administration; Gov. Daniel J. Evans of Washington, a moderate without any connection with Watergate or any other Nixon Administration controversies; and three Republican senators: Lowell P. Weicker Jr. of Connecticut, and Howard H. Baker Jr. and Bill Brock, both of Tennessee.

Both Weicker and Baker served on the Senate Watergate Committee, where the Connecticut senator was the most outspoken Nixon critic.

One of the sources said that background checks on Bush had turned up a potential problem.

Newsweek Magazine on Sunday said Bush has "slipped badly because of alleged irregularities in the financing of his 1970 Senate race in Texas."

Mr. Ford's affirmation that Rockefeller still was in the running for the vice presidency came after Watergate investigators checked and dismissed a report about allegedly derogatory information about Rockefeller.

The incident grew out of a visit Aug. 11 by a man who identified himself only

as "Mr. Long" to Philip Buchen, a Ford friend and adviser. TerHorsd said Long gave Buchen in ormation about the location of and contents of papers of Watergate conspirator E. Howard Hunt and claimed "there ought to be some things he (Ford) ought to know" if Rockefeller was being considered for Vice President.

A news release bearing the name of Hamilton A. Long of Philadelphia, a retired lawyer, and left at news media offices said Long contacted Buchen to help prevent Mr. Ford from making a too-hasty vice presidential selection.

Long said he had no firsthand knowledge of the allegedly derogatory information, but said he had received his information from an informant.

'Eagleton Affair'

The statement said Long agreed to contact Buchen "to avoid President Ford's being caught in another 'Eagleton affair' like 1968" — an apparent reference to the 1972 decision of Democratic presidential nominee George S. McGovern to drop Sen. Thomas F. Eagleton (D-Mo) as his running mate after learning Eagleton had undergone shock treatment.

The statement said Long acted by himself in contacting Buchen and that Long "is not associated with any group or organization and has never been active politically."

TerHorst said the intermation was turned over to Watergate prosecutor Leon Jaworski, who obtained access to two safety deposit boxes in a bank vault in which it was thought the copies of Hunt's papers might be found. They were not found and the matter is closed, ter-Horst said.

This relates to the on-going investigation to resolve a report that documents were removed from E. Howard Hunt's Office 6/18/72 indicating that New York Governor Nelson Rockefeller had made contributions to the McGovern campaign and had hired thugs to disrupt the 1972 Democratic National Convention if McGovern was not nominated. Allegations of this nature were received by both the Special Prosecution Force and the White House.

We have now been advised that Columnist Jack Anderson and his associate Les Witten will release a story on this inquiry on Friday, 8/16/74. It is believed by the Special Prosecution Force that Witten may have been the original source of this information to the White House.

On the evening of 8/11/74 Assistant Watergate Special Prosecutor Richard Ben-Veniste related to WFO that Special Prosecutor Jaworski had received information from a confidential source that one Hal O'Brien, later identified by WFO as Harold Johnson O'Brien, 1346 Connecticut Avenue, Washington, D. C., had in his possession or knew the whereabouts of the above-described documents. O'Brien was interviewed by the Special Prosecution Force on 8/12/74 during which he advised one Roy Sheppard admitted to O'Brien he had lied to the grand jury in 1973 and, in fact, had secreted certain documents in a safe deposit box in Pulaski, Virginia, under his sister's name. These documents allegedly belong to E. Howard Hunt and contained information detrimental to Nelson The documents allegedly state that Rockefeller Rockefeller. contributed funds to the McGovern campaign and that he hired thugs to disrupt the Democratic National Convention if McGovern was not nominated. 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At approximately 4:00 pm, 8/13/74, White House Counsel to the President advised FBI liaison that the administrative aide to Senator Lowell Weicker had contacted the Office of the President on Capitol Hill reporting that they had received information from a Mr. Long of the Heritage Book Shop in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, to the effect that Hal O'Brien of Washington, D. C., had possession of information which was detrimental to Nelson Rockefeller. It is not known whether this Mr. Long is also the source of information to Mr. Jaworski.

Sheppard is the employee of the Alexandria Delivery Company who allegedly removed documents from the Executive Office Building office of E. Howard Hunt on 6/18/72 at the direction of Ken Smith of the Committee to Reelect the President. Sheppard, und grant of immunity, furnished no information to the grand jury in support of the allegation that he had removed these documents from Hunt's office.

Results of Investigation Our Philadelphia Office has determined that the only Heritage Book Shop in their vicinity is the one at Pottstown, Pennsylvania, which is owned and operated by two women. There are no known male owners or employees. The Pottstown Police Department know of no "Mr. Long" to be assoicated with this shop. There is a Heritage Publisher, Inc., in Philadelphia, which is a publisher of trade journals. This is operated by three male individuals, none of whom have the surname Long and there are no other employees. A pretext telephone call to this company reveale Mr. Long is not known at that location.

There are two banks located in Pulaski and contact at these institutions developed no safe deposit boxes are rented to Roy Sheppard or any of his five sisters who were identified throug our investigation. Interview of Sheppard's eldest sister was unproductive in resolving issue. She declined cooperation based on request of Sheppard.

Further investigation at the Bank of Virginia, Pulaski, disclosed two safe deposit boxes rented to persons with surname Sheppard; degree of relationship to Roy Sheppard not known at this time.

Investigation is being coordinated with the Special Prosecution Force and all leads are being extensively pursued.

SUBJECT: SPECIAL PROJECT -TAPE TRANSCRIPTIONS FOR SPECIAL PROSECUTOR'S OFFICE

In response to the call you received from Jim Vorenberg in the Special Prosecutor's Office this morning and our subsequent discussions in connection therewith, I returned his call at approximately 3:15 p.m. on August 23, 1974.

I advised Mr. Vorenberg that I had checked into the matter that he had discussed with you involving the attention called to Carl Feldbaum of his staff of one item in one of the transcriptions dealing with a very sensitive operation in order that they may be alerted to the impact this would have should it be inadvertently made public and particularly of the adverse effect it would have upon the intelligence community and, more specifically, the detriment it would be in our performing our responsibilities in this area of our operations.

I assured him that in calling this to his attention we in no way intended to imply or question the material being transcribed, but rather we felt we had the responsibility and would be derelict if we did not call the significance of this information to the attention of the Special Prosecutor. I further assured Vorenberg that this project which we are doing at the request of the Special Prosecutor is being performed in compliance with arrangements that had been worked out with the Special Prosecutor's staff to insure complete security to the material involved.

Vorenberg stated he was merely concerned that we may be going contrary to the desires of the court and Special Prosecutor if in fact our personnel were extracting portions of interest to the FBI and passing such up to higher Bureau officials, which would be contrary to the desires of the court and the Special Prosecutor's Office. I assured Vorenberg that no such activity was occurring, that there was complete understanding as to the manner in which this material was to be transcribed, the security afforded it and the fact that w were merely performing a function for his office and therefore I could assure him without hesitation that this type of activity was not involved; i.e. passing bits and pieces along to FBI officials. I assured Vorenberg that Bureau officials

were particularly sensitive to this undertaking and had no interest whatever in receiving bits or pieces or the whole content of any of the material involved in this project. I pointed out, however, I felt the employee spotting the item highlighted for their attention displayed particular alertness in this matter and in turn we would have been derelict I felt had we not alerted the Special Prosecutor's Office to the possible ramifications of this item, should it be released to the public, inadvertently or otherwise. Mr. Vorenberg stated that he was satisfied with this assurance that we were functioning as desired by the Special Prosecutor's Office; however, he did want to make the inquiry in view of the material having been called to their attention and recognized that it was an isolated incident and in effect agreed it was proper to have called it to their attention. He ended up by expressing appreciation for the excellent cooperation that the Special Prosecutor's Office had been receiving from the Bureau.

The cross-check between information appearing in the Watergate computer printout and the FBI general indices has now been completed and with the submission of the enclosed documents, all written and oral statements which could be identified as having been made to the FBI by the individuals in question during the period June 17, 1972 to the present time have been furnished to the SPF.

This document contains neither recommendations nor conclusions of the FBI. It is the property of the FBI and is loaned to your agency; it and its contents are not to be distributed outside your agency.

Mr. Kreindler was informed on this occasion that the White House had made Special Inquiry in connection with Nelson Rockefeller's nomination as Vice President and, in that regard, a summary of this investigation was being furnished to the White House. Mr. Kreindler said the Special Prosecution Force had no objection to this disclosure.

In view of the above, no further action will be taken by this Bureau in the absence of a specific request of the Special Prosecution Force.



On August 11, 1974, the Office of the Special Prosecutor advised information had been received that one Hall O'Brien, 1346 Connecticut Avenue, N.W., Washington, , either had in his possession or knew the whereabouts of documents once belonging to E. Howard Hunt. A discreet inquiry was requested to fully identify Hal O'Brien of the above address and to identify one Roy H. Sheppard who, it was recalled from the Watergate investigation, was allegedly involved with the Hunt papers.



On August 13, 1974, the Special Prosecution Force advised that O'Brien had been interviewed by that office on the evening of August 12, 1974, at which time O'Brien related that Roy Sheppard had informed O'Brien that he, Sheppard, lied before the grand jury in 1973 and, in fact, he had secreted in a safe deposit box in Pulaski, Virginia, under his sister's name, certain documents which belonged to E. Howard Hunt. These documents allegedly stated that Nelson Rockefeller contributed funds to the McGovern campaign and that Rockefeller had hired thugs to disrupt the Democratic Convention if McGovern was not nominated. Later, on August 13, 1974, this Bureau was

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advised by White House Counsel to the President of substantially the same information as furnished by the Special Prosecution Force and, in addition, that Senator Lowell Wiecker's administrative aide had advised that a "Mr. Long" of the Heritage Book Shop in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, had informed that office that Hal O'Brien possessed documents detrimental to Rockefeller.

A check of all telephone and city directories for the Philadelphia metropolitan area (including the Camden, New Jersey, area) failed to disclose any listing for a Heritage Book Shop. Logical sources were contacted and they were unfamiliar with any retail or wholesale establishment with that name.

A Pennsylvania Bell Telephone Company representative advised the Philadelphia FBI Office that there is a Heritage Book Shop in Pottstown, Pennsylvania (telephone 215-323-5971), which is in Montgomery County. It should be noted that although this is the same area code as Philadelphia, the town itself is approximately 45 miles from Philadelphia. It was further determined from this representative that there is a Heritage Publications located on Horter Street, Philadelphia; however, there is no indication that this company is identical or related to the Heritage Book Shop.

Robert D. Porter, owner, Credit Bureau of Pottstown, advised that the Heritage Book Shop was owned and operated by Elizabeth G. Jackson and Priscilla Revell. No males are known to be owners or employees. Pottstown police sources substantiated this. No person named "Long" was know to be connected with this shop.

Heritage Publications, Philadelphia, was determined to be a publisher of trade journals. Timothy Davis, Wendell Hughes and Frank Morris are officers and there are no other employees. Investigation determined "Mr. Long" is unknown to this firm.

No further investigation was conducted to identify "Mr. Long" since O'Brien had advised the Special Prosecution Force that Roy Sheppard was the original source of O'Brien's and "Mr. Long's" allegation. "Mr. Long" subsequently, on 8/18/74, identified himself to the news media as being Hamilton A. Long, Public Ledger Building, Philadelphia, an elderly lawyer, author, and lecturer.

Marriage records, Pulaski County Circuit Court were reviewed at which time the following information was obtained:

On December 22, 1973, LALA SHEPPARD, daughter of C. F. SHEPPARD, and HELEN DELP SHEPPARD, married GLENN LACY (TRACY?).

On April 10, 1937, GAYE SHEPPARD, daughter of C. F. and HELEN SHEPPARD, married JOHN LUCADO.

Check of the City Directories for the Town of Pulaski, Virginia reflected the following:

LALA H. TRACY, widow of GLENN TRACY, resides at 220 Pierce Avenue, Pulaski, Virginia.

JOHN PRESTON LUCADO, wife - GAYE, resides at 202 South Madison Street, Pulaski, Virginia.

The directories reflect no listing for C. F., ROY, NANCY, LENA, or IRENE SHEPPARD.

Mrs. PEGGY HINSON, Virginia National Bank, and Mr. GARLEN B. CALLAHAN, The Bank of Virginia-Pulaski, both advised that they had no record that GAYE and JOHN PRESTON LUCADO had a safe deposit box at their respective banks.

Mrs. ELIZABETH HILL, The Bank of Virginia-Pulaski, advised that with respect to Mrs. C. F. SHEPPARD, who was currently a co-subscriber to safe deposit box #147 at that bank, if it is the same one that she recalls, she recalls

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that this Mrs. SHEPPARD is an elderly widow, who was currently residing in the Washington, D. C. area with one of her sons, name unknown. She stated that CLAYTON K. SHEPPARD, JAMES W. SHEPPARD, and LENA B. SHEPPARD are unknown to her.

BEATRICE K. OGLE, New Accounts, Bank of Virginia-Pulaski, advised that with respect to Mrs. C. F. SHEPPARD, who was currently a co-holder of safe deposit box #147 at that bank, is known to her, if it is the same one that she is thinking about, as an old widow lady, who is currently residing in the Washington, D. C. area, possibly Falls Church or Alexandria, Virginia, with one of her children. She stated that she could only recall seeing two of Mrs. SHEPPARD's children, a male and a female, names unknown. She indicated that it has been some period of time since she has seen Mrs. SHEPPARD. She stated that CLAYTON SHEPPARD, JAMES W. SHEPPARD and LENA B. SHEPPARD are unknown to her.

The following individuals were contacted by SA PATRICK J. RUTZINSKI on August 15, 1974:

All of the above individuals were contacted with respect to the entire SHEPPARD family with negative results.

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LALA TRACY, 220 Pierce Avenue, Pulaski, Virginia, was contacted by SA PATRICK J. RUTZINSKI of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, and at the outset, was apprised that the contact was being made at the specific request of the Special Prosecutor's Office in Washington, D. C., and the purpose of the contact was to obtain the names of her relatives, particularly her sisters and brothers.

She readily admitted that ROY SHEPPARD was her brother; however, upon contacting her son, BILLY TRACY, who resides next door to her, she respectfully declined to furnish the names of her relatives, stating that she did not want to become involved, nor did she want to testify in a Court of Law against her brother.

During the course of contact with TRACY, it was learned from her that she is the eldest of eight (8) children and that ROY SHEPPARD is about 54 years old. She related that all of her brothers and sisters, with the exception of one of her sisters, Mrs. LUCADO, reside in the northern Virginia area, around Washington, D. C., all residing within about 25 miles of where her brother ROY is currently living.

She related that her brother, ROY SHEPPARD, had previously been in contact with his brothers and sisters, exact date not specified, and had related that he had become involved in some sort of difficulty and that the members of the family should not talk about him with anyone as he did not want to get the family involved.

She later had determined that ROY was involved in "Watergate" and stated that ROY had operated a delivery service of some sort and apparently had made pickups from and deliveries to the Presidential White House in Washington, D. C., which pickups and deliveries had allegedly contained "Watergate" papers. However, ROY claimed that these pickups and deliveres were in boxes and he in fact. did not even

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know what was in the boxes. She again respectfully declined to furnish the names of her relatives and stated that she was at a loss to understand why the Federal Bureau of Investigation was contacting her and not contacting her brother, ROY SHEPPARD.

GARLEN B. CALLAHAN, Cashier, the Bank of Virginia-Pulaski, #1 Nain Street, Pulaski, Virginia, advised that his current safe deposit box records reflect the following information:

Box #147 is currently rented to Mrs. C. F. SIEPPARD and CLAYTON K. SHEPPARD, whose address is Post Office Box 444, Pulaski, Virginia. He noted that this box was initially rented on November 10, 1958, and the current rental fee is paid until September 1, 1974.

Box #446, is currently rented to JAMES W. SHEPPARD or LENA B. SHEPPARD, mailing address - Post Office Box 444, Pulaski, Virginia, which box was initially rented on December 23, 1969, by the above two individuals, who at that time indicated that they were residing at 223 Lexington Avenue, Pulaski, Virginia.

CLAYTON KYDELL SHEPPARD was located and interviewed at his home, 6006 Amherst Road, Springfield, Virginia. He was advised of the identities of the interviewing Agents and that the Agents were seeking the whereabouts of JAMES W. and LENA SHEPPARD. CLAYTON SHEPPARD advised that JAMES W. and LENA were his brother and sister, however, he would not advise the Agents of their current address, until such time as he was appraised of the Agents request.

He was informed that an inquiry was being made on behalf of the Watergate Special Prosecutor, to determine if JAMES W. and/or LENA SHEPPARD rented or owned safe deposit boxes in Pulaski, Virginia. CLAYTON SHEPPARD said he, himself, would not answer that question for his sister and brother. When asked if he had such a box, he said, "No, I do not." He then inquired as to why the Agents felt it necessary to knock on his door at 10:00 PM in the evening. It was explained to Mr. SHEPPARD that the Agents and the Prosecutor's Office, were attempting to verify an allegation that someone in the SHEPPARD family, had possession of papers belonging to E. HOWARD HUNT and/or DOROTHY HUNT.

CLAYTON SHEPPARD immediately replied he knew nothing about this.

He was then asked to identify all the members of his own family exluding his young children. He at first confirmed the fact that his parents FRANK CLAYTON and HELEN were deceased. He then stated that in addition to himself, he has two brothers, ROY HENSEL SHEPPARD and JAMES W. SHEPPARD. He then confirmed the fact that the names of his sisters were, TRACEY, IRENE, GAY, LENA, and NANCY.

He was asked if any of them had a safe deposit box in Pulaski, Virginia. He replied the Agents could get that answer from other interviews. He was asked if his wife had a safe deposit box or had access to a safe deposit box in Pulaski, Virginia. He replied he wouldn't answer that question. He preferred the Agents ask his wife. When asked if he would make her available for an interview this evening, he said she was playing Bingo at the American Legion and was due home between

Special Agent LANO then asked Mr. SHEPPARD if he would contact JAMES and LENA and inform them that it was an urgent request that we interview them this evening. He agreed to do so, but went further adding, he would not pressure them into an agreement. SHEPPARD did agree to permit the Agents to interview his wife upon her return.

At approximately 11:30 PM, while parked on the street adjacent to the SHEPPARD residence, CLAYTON SHEPPARD handed Special Agent LANO a slip of paper, which bore the address, 5375 Duke Street. SHEPPARD commented that "all of them are there, ROY, JAMES, and LENA' you'll get all the answers to your questions."

CLAYTON SHEPPARD further stated that JAMES agreed to talk to the Agents if they could arrive there shortly. It was agreed that after the interview of Mrs. SHEPPARD, LENA, JAMES and ROY would be contacted.

CLAYTON SHEPPARD commented during the course of the interview that whenever he hears of a problem that involves ROY, he just turns his head away and refuses to listen.

MRS. ROBERTA SHEPPARD, also known as MRS. CLAYTON K. SHEPPARD, was advised of the identities of the interviewing agents and their purpose in contacting her at this hour.

She was asked if she had a safe deposit box in Pulaski, Virginia, and she repplied, "No".

She was asked if she had access to a safe deposit box in Pulaski, Virginia, and she again said, "No".

She was asked if she knew if anyone in the SHEPPARD family had a safe deposit box in Pulaski, Virginia. Before she could answer, her husband informed her that she did not have to speak for the rest of the family, to which she readily agreed.

She was then asked if she ever had in her possession or seen in anyone else's possession, any documents which purportedly belonged to HOWARD or DOROTHY HUNT: She replied "No".

She was asked if she ever had or had ever seen any document that contained information detrimental to any political figure or politician in the possession of any member of the SHEPPARD family. She replied "No".

When told by the agents that HUNT was a figure connected with the "Watergate Affair", she stated she knows nothing about the Watergate case and never read about it in the press.

When asked if she could recall the last time she was in Pulaski, MRS. SHEPPARD advised that she was there in May or June of this year and in fact, she visits Pulaski every summer for at least two weeks.

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JAMES W. SHEPPARD was located and interviewed in Apartment 216, at 5375 Duke Street, Alexandria, Virginia.

SHEPPARD said he was aware of the Agents investigation and his only concern was over the lateness of the interview. He intimated the Agents could have found him at this address in the daytime. He was informed that it was not until 11:30 PM this evening, August 15, 1974, that the Agents even knew he lived in Alexandria, Virginia.

He stated when he learned from CLAYTON SHEPPARD, his brother, that the Agents wanted to speak with him, he placed a call to his lawyer, BEN COTTON, in Mc Lean, Virginia. The attorney had not returned the call, however, he was willing to answer any questions at this time.

He was asked if he had a safe deposit box or if he shared a safe deposit box with anyone in Pulaski, Virginia, or elsewhere? He replied he shares a box with his sister LENA in Pulaski, Virginia.

He was then asked the following question:

"Would you, JAMES SHEPPARD, if asked by a representative of the United States Government, travel to or accompany someone to Pulaski, Virginia for the purpose of inspecting that box?" He replied "No." He stated "if anyone wants to get into the box, let them get a court order."

He stated the last time he was in the box was about two years ago. He accompanied his sister LENA to the bank. They were looking for the house deed. He could not recall the date but stated the bank would have a record of it.

He was asked if, to his knowledge, the box contained any documents belonging to DOROTHY or HOWARD HUNT: He replied that the box he shares with LENA to the best of hiw knowledge contained personal papers.

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He stated that to his knowledge, there are no papers or documents belonging to ROY SHEPPARD in the box. However, there may be some "bonds" belonging to ROY. He He further stated he has not been asked by ROY SHEPPARD to hold or hide any documents in the box. He stated that he does not have rented or access to any other safe deposit box in the United States.

FEDERAL BUREAU OF INVESTIGATION

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LENA SHEPPARD was interviewed in Apartment 216, at 5375 Duke Street, Alexandria, Virginia, after being advised of the identities of the Agents. She acknowledged she knew the purpose of the interview.

LENA SHEPPARD stated as follows:

She and her brother, JAMES W. SHEPPARD share a safe deposit box in Pulaski, Virginia. The last time she entered this box was about two years ago. Her mother wanted to know if the deed to the house was contained in the box. She, her mother, and JAMES went to the bank to look for the deed. She stated she could not recall the date, but believed the bank has a record. In any event, they did not find the deed. That was the last time she was in the box.

When asked if she would travel to Pulaski, Virginia with a representative of the Government merely to inspect the contents of the box, she replied "no". She stated the box contains only personal papers and perhaps some of ROY's bonds; but nothing else. She stated the box does not contain any documents belonging to HOWARD HUNT or DOROTHY HUNT. She stated she has not seen any such documents, nor has ROY SHEPPARD ever lead her to believe that he had any. She stated ROY SHEPPARD has not asked her to hide or hold any documents either in the apartment or in the bank box in Pulaski, Virginia.

At the conclusion of the interview LENA SHEPPARD was served with Federal Grand Jury subpoena ordering her to appear before that body on August 16, 1974 at 10:30 A.M.

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FEDERAL BUREAU OF INVESTIGATION

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ROY HENSEL SHEPPARD was located and interviewed in Apartment 216, at 5375 Duke Street, Alexandria, Virginia, where he furnished the following statement:

He first heard of a news story concerning his concealing or moving documents of HOWARD or DOROTHY HUNT, when he received a telephone call from LES WHITTEN. WHITTEN told him that it was important that he speak with SHEPPARD about his actions on behalf of HUNT. ROY SHEPPARD said he told WHITTEN that he had nothing to say, since he had already testified before the Grand Jury and the Senate Select Committee and if WHITTEN wanted any information, WHITTEN could read that material.

ROY SHEPPARD said he learned from WHITTEN that JACK ANDERSON had written a story in a Washington state newspaper on Monday of this week, that SHEPPARD had documents which contain derogatory information about NELSON ROCKEFELLER. SHEPPARD told the Agents he wished ANDERSON would print a story like that so he could file a libel suit. He said the story was a lie and that he never saw or had any such documents.

At this point, ROY SHEPPARD said he was attempting to contact his lawyer this evening and would prefer to discuss certain areas with his attorney first, before going further.

ROY SHEPPARD was then orally advised of his rights by Special Agent LANO and after acknowledging the fact that he understood his rights, he agreed to answer some additional questions.

ROY H. SHEPPARD was asked if he had in his possession or seen in anyone else's possession, any documents purportedly belonging to HOWARD HUNT or DOROTHY HUNT, which dealt with NELSON ROCKEFELLER or any other political figure. He replied, "No." He then stated that he has had no documents that ever were or could have been related to any "Watergate figure" or any candidate for political office.

He further stated he has taken no documents to Pulaski, Virginia, to conceal in a safe deposit box. He was

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then asked if he concealed any Watergate related material in a safe deposit box, anywhere in the United States of America and he said, "No."

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He concluded by stating he did not ask any member of his family to place any documents pertaining to persons involved in the Watergate affair in a safe deposit box in Pulaski, Virginia.

SHEPPARD was then served with a subpoena to appear before the Federal Grand Jury on August 16, 1974 at 10:30 AM.

Before leaving, SHEPPARD was asked if he possessed or had access to a safe deposit box and he said, "No."

JAMES WALTER MC CORD, JR.

The Special Prosecution Force advised on August 16, 1974, that in answer to the subpoenas served on Lena Sheppard, and Roy Sheppard, James W. Sheppard has agreed to proceed to Pulaski, Virginia, and with power of attorney for Clayton Sheppard, voluntarily consent to search of the two safe deposit boxes previously identified.

conversation she directed questions to him. Of interest to VOLNER was the following:

"The enclosed memorandum to referenced Philadelphia airtel dated 4/24/73, page three, paragraph one, contains statement "MC GRUDER said that there was a third proposal by LIDDY which he believed was for approximately \$350,000." A review of this indicates that the amount was actually \$250,000. It is evident that the LIDDY proposal was in fact \$250,000 inasmuch as relevant questions asked MC GRUDER during the polygraph set forth in the questions the sum of \$250,000.

VOLNER also wanted an elaboration on the statement paragraph three, page three, of this memorandum "MC GRUDER said that he has no specific recollection that JOHN METCHELL in this third meeting voiced absolute approval of LIDDY's contemplated use of electronic devices in the Democratic National Committee Headquarters." It was explained to VOLNER that it is self-evident that MITCHELL had approved LIDDY's overall operation and proposal because MC GRUDER answered yes to one question "Do you know for certain that JOHN MITCHELL agreed to fund \$250,000 for LIDDY's covert activities?" (Question 7, series 2, 4/19/73). It was explained that in otherwords as of 4/19/73 MC GRUDER was claiming he did not recall specifically discussing with MITCHELL electronic devices being used in LIDDY's proposed covert activities. VOLNER said this clarified the issue because MC GRUDER had after that date acknowledged that he did recall MITCHELL granting approval apparently including approval of use of electronic devices. It was pointed out to VOLNER that the memorandum also stated that it was evident that MC GRUDER had additional information he had not disclosed; however, the polygraph could not continue until the polygraph examiner had been more thoroughly briefed.

Also in answer to her inquiry she was advised that SA ANGELO LANO of the Washington Field Office was present when the polygraph examination was conducted. Further, that his name appears on the polygraph charts of SA PEARCE.

Washington Field Office was advised to furnish VOLNER a copy of any additional written report of this interview including FD 302.

VOLNER advised that it was possible and even probable that SA PEARCE may be called to testify at the MITCHELL, GORDON STRACHAN, ET AL, trial scheduled for September 1974 in Washington, D.C., inasmuch as SA PEARCE's memorandum apparently will be disclosed to the defense. She said she did not see any problems involved.

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LALA TRACY, 220 Pierce Avenue, Pulaski, Virginia, was contacted by SA PATRICK J. RUTZINSKI of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, and at the outset, was apprised that the contact was being made at the specific request of the Special Prosecutor's Office in Mashington, D. C., and the purpose of the contact was to obtain the names of her relatives, particularly her sisters and brothers.

She readily admitted that ROY SHEPPARD was her brother; however, upon contacting her son, BILLY TRACY, who resides next door to her, she respectfully declined to furnish the names of her relatives, stating that she did not want to become involved, nor did she want to testify in a Court of Law against her brother.

On August 22, 1974, while in Kansas City, James Vorenberg, Acting Special Prosecutor in the absence of Mr. Jaworski and Mr. Ruth, phoned me. He said that he had received information that we had monitored one of the tapes and that a representative of our Washington Field Office had gone to the Special Prosecutor's Office stating that there was certain material in the tape which might be very sensitive and inquired what could be done to make sure that it is not disclosed.

Mr. Vorenberg said he construed our role as being that of transcribers on a mechanical basis. He said that he further thought no use should be made of the material and that it should be handled in such a manner. He said further that he felt that the clerks engaged in the transcription were actually assigned to the Special Prosecutor's Office and the supervisors of them were in the role of relieving them or generally managing and were not to assume the role of monitors. He hoped he would receive assurances that there would be no record made of the tape and no maintenance of such records in our files.

I told Mr. Vorenberg that I would check into this although I felt that our role had been pretty well established and further that under a strict construction of the arrangement we were not going to try to maintain any monitorship of the tapes.

I then phoned Mr. Callahan who said that, in a subsequent contact with the Special Prosecutor's Office, this matter had been resolved and there appeared to be no conflict in our action which was predicated on the revelation of some very sensitive material, so sensitive that were it to be given publicity inadventently it would harm our national security.

SUBJECT: CBS NEWS BROADCAST CONCERNING ALLEGED FBI BURGLARIES

1. Wallet 11 Rodney Nordell, "Christian Science Monitor," telephone number 617-262-2300, extension 2338, telephonically inquired of SA John J. Hinchcliffe if Mr. Kelley had any statements as to the reports of FEI burglaries.

When asked specifically what he was referring to, Mr. Nordell said that CBS Radio News stated that Mr. Buzhardt had testified to the Senate Watergate Committee concerning FBI burglaries and has stated that the "Rolling Stone" magazine documented more than 100 cases since 1969. CES News stated that Samuel Dash of the Watergate Committee did not pursue the allegation concerning the FBI.

The External Affairs Division, through its liaison with CBS, obtained a copy (attached) of the broadcast in question, which CBS stated was based on an advance news release for the forthcoming issue of "Rolling Stone."

A review of the CBS newscast indicated an attempt to tie an allegation of "at least 100 break-ins, apparently political in nature," supposedly documented by the magazine "Rolling Stone," with the alleged testimony of former White House counsel Fred Buzhardt before the Senate Watergate Committee that Buzhardt knew of "break-ins since 1969 and said they were performed by the FBI."

SA Hinchcliffe advised Mr. Nordell that any inquiries concerning the Watergate investigation should be directed to the office of Special 139-40011 Prosecutor Jaworski.

On September 18, 1974, Leon Jaworski, Special Frosecutor in the Watergate matter, phoned me. He said a subpoena had been issued and should be served on former I resident Nixon. He said that an offer had been made to stipulate concerning the testimony that the F residential tapes had been kept secure. This stipulation, however, had not been accepted and now it is necessary to get the testimony of former I resident Nixon to this effect. He said that due to adverse publicity ensuing from the previous attempt to serve a subpoent on former I resident Nixon as a result of United States Marshal activities, this service would be inadvisable. He thereupon asked that we make this service.

I informed Mr. Jaworski that I would consider this and would call him back. Thereafter I did return his call and told him in accordance with discussions had with Messrs. Mintz and Adams and Jenkins, we would make the service through an Agent of the Los Angeles Office. I fold him, however, that prior to this, we would like to have him call the Attorney General's office and inform them of his request to us.

Mr. Jaworski said that he would do so and I subsequently learned that he had informed the Deputy Attorney General of this request and that no objection had been made to such service.



H.R. 16750 was introduced on 9/19/74 by Edward S. Koch (Democrat-Liberal, New York) for himself and 19 other members; 16751 was introduced on 9/19/74 by Koch for himself and Michael J. Harrington (Democrat, Massachusetts); 16794 was introduced on 9/23/74 by Koch for himself and eight other members. The three bills are identical in content and language and all have been referred to the House Judiciary Committee. A copy of H.R. 16750 is attached for information.

The question has been raised whether this legislation, if enacted into law, would eventually force public disclosure of all matters concerning the so-called "White House 17" wiretaps, which were operated by the FBI with the approval of the Attorney General under the authority of the President in order to identify those responsible for leaks which seriously compromised the national security. This memorandum responds to that question in the negative.

It is felt that the language in captioned bills is open to serious question as to its completeness. A close reading discloses that many of the major phrases contained therein are not susceptible to specific definition, and, if tested, the law could very well be held unconstitutionally vague.

Even if the law's validity were upheld on appeal, a very good case can be made that, in the narrow sense the court is required to interpret the language of legislation, the electronic surveillances were not in any manner "Watergate-related" nor "related to Watergate matters" (other than as a corollary matter which came to light during, or as a result of, a sustained attack upon an administration). This is not felt to be a sufficiently strong causal relationship to justify application of the law to our electronic coverage.

However, if it were determined that this legislation did carry the power to force a full public disclosure of all matters pertaining to the "White House 17" (and obviously Executive privilege, national security and/or Top Secret classification would no longer be a valid defense against disclosure), this would have a severely detrimental effect upon the FBI in the form of possible deterioration of the Bureau's public image as well as civil and/or criminal action against present and former FBI employees.

ACTION:

It is recommended that the Legal Counsel Division analyze this proposed legislation, and if the conclusion is reached that it could lead to detailed disclosure of the above-mentioned coverage, recipients of this memorandum be so advised and Congressional Services thereupon closely follow its progress.

ADDENDUM BY THE LEGAL COUNSEL DIVISION, 10/7/74, JH:deh

The Legal Counsel Division is unable to speculate as to the answer for the hypothetical question raised. Technically, "Watergate - Related" should pertain only to matters involving the break in of the Democratic National Headquarters. Watergate has come to mean much more than that burglary, however. We feel it is extremely unlikely that this poorly worded bill would be passed in this form and suggest its progress be followed by the Congressional Services Unit.

Special Agents WILLIAM C. CARROLL and JOHNIE L. JOYCE, JR., in the company of Deputy United States Marshal JOHN WHITMORE, were driven on a golf cart from the United States Secret Service Compound, which is located on the property of the United States Coast Guard adjacent to the residence of RICHARD M. NIXON, by RONALD ZIEGLER, former Press Secretary to the President and present staff member of RICHARD M. NIXON at San Clemente, California. ZIEGLER drove to the driveway of the residence of RICHARD M. NIXON and indicated to the Agents and Deputy WHITMORE that they should wait in the driveway. He then entered what appeared to be the side entrance of the residence, which is a distance of approximately 20 feet from where the golf cart was parked.

Shortly thereafter, RICHARD M. NIXON and ZIEGLER exited the front door of the residence and walked briskly towards the waiting Agents and Deputy United States Marshal. Mr. NIXON was smiling as he approached and stated, "Good evening, gentlemen. They're keeping you busy these days." It is noted Mr. NIXON had walked approximately 25 feet from the front entrance prior to stopping and shaking hands with Special Agent CARROLL. At this time, which was 5:50 PM (Pacific Daylight Time), he was handed a subpoena by Special Agent CARROLL commanding him to appear in the United States District Court, District of Columbia, on October 1, 1974, at 10:00 AM, in the case of "United States of America v. JOHN N. MITCHELL, et al."

Mr. NIXON accepted the subpoena with his right hand and immediately reached across his body and handed it to RONALD ZIEGLER, who was standing to his left and slightly behind. He then was handed two subpoenas by Deputy United States Marshal WHITMORE which he also handed to ZIEGLER in the same manner.

At this point, Mr. NIXON again shook hands with Special Agent CARROLL, stepped back, indicating he was leaving, and stated something to the effect, "Did you have a good drive down?" As he turned to return to his residence, he thanked the Agents and the Deputy United States Marshal, waved his right hand and returned to the residence through the same door from which he had exited.

The Director has inquired whether we should not have a release before furnishing the Special Prosecutor's Office (SPO) with copies of applicant reports dealing with John W. Dean III.

In this regard, the SPO thought the White House had requested the FBI to conduct a Special Inquiry concerning Dean when he was being considered for the position of Counsel to the President. However, the fact is that no such Special Inquiry was ever conducted for the White House and the only applicant investigation we conducted on Dean was in 1969 at the request of the Department when Dean was a Departmental applicant for a "special candidate" position (Bureau file 77-107005).

The Director is quite right that had we conducted a White House Special Inquiry concerning Dean we would have needed a release from the White House prior to disseminating results of such an investigation to the SPO or to any other agency. Since the only applicant reports we have concerning Jean related to investigation conducted at the request of the Department, and the SPO is a part of the Department of Justice, there appeared to be no need to have a release before fundishing copies of Dean's Departmental applicant investigation to the SPO.

Pursuant to your request, there is attached a copy of the policy statement followed by this Eureau in regard to the retention of investigative notes by our Special Agents. The attached statement was received in a memorandum from Herbert J. Miller, Jr., Assistant Attorney General, Criminal Division, dated April 18, 1961, and the substance of the policy was incorporated verbatim into written instructions issued to all Special Agents of the FH.

If a Special Agent is questioned concerning the destruction of his investigative notes, he should reply that it is a policy established by the Assistant Attorney General, Criminal Division, Department of Justice. For your assistance, United States v. Terrell, 474 F2d 872 (2d Cir. 1973) and numerous cases cited therein support the proposition that the Jencks Act does not impose a duty on our Special Agents to retain rough notes when their contents are incorporated in official reports and they destroy their notes in good faith.

For your additional information, our written instructions to Agents provide in relevant part:

> "An Agent's notes of a precise character, made to record his own findings, must always be retained. Such notes include, but are not limited to, accountants' work papers, and notes covering matters, such as crime scene searches, laboratory examinations, and fingerprint examinations. If a doubtful situation arises, resolve the question in favor of keeping the notes."

In other situations than those just set forth the agent's notes do not constitute a statement under the statute and need not be retained. Whenever the issue of note retention is raised during trial, one problem is that of demonstrating that the agent's discarded notes were not a producible statement. We do not think that the non-existence of the notes is an obstacle in this regard. If the agent is operating under clear instructions to retain the types of notes described above, and if it is his custom to follow those instructions, he can so testify, and we feel that compliance with the statute can be adequately shown by this method.

In any case where notes have been discarded under the above criteria we will be prepared to argue the correctness of such action in the courts.

Please feel free to communicate further at any time regarding this important subject.

On October 25, 1974, Jill W. Volner, Assistant Special Prosecutor, Watergate Special Prosecution Force, telephonically advised me that Special Agent Daniel C. Mahan of the Washington Field Office will be called as a prosecution witness in the Watergate prosecution currently pending the United States District Court in the District of Columbia She said that one question that they expect will be raised by the defense on cross-examination is the matter of destruction of investigative notes prepare by Special Agent Mahan. She said that this matter will be of particular interest to the defense because one of the allegations in the case is that Kenneth Parkinson, one of the defendants, is accused of having destroyed certain notes that he made. Miss Volner asked whether we had any written Bureau policy that could be used as a guide in presenting SA Mahan's testimony so that the destruction of his rough investigative notes could be explained and justified as a written and lawful practice of the Bureau.

I told Miss Volner that I would prefer that FBI manual sections not be offered in evidence and asked her whether some other means for establishing the Bureau policy might be acceptable to here She said that it would be possible for her to have a document indicating the Bureau policy and that she could use that document as a basis for examining the Agent in his testimony in chief and she could hold/up for the jury to see without actually introducing it in evidence. (Bufile 66-2435-2548) In general, the instructions are that written material developed during an investigation which should be retained are written statements signed by a witness, or approved or adopted by a witness, or other notes which are a verbatim recital of an oral statement by a witness. Rough notes from which the Agent subsequently prepares the FD-302 interview report form need not be retained. The instructions from the Department were issued because a decision of the Supreme Court in Campbell v. U.S., 365 U.S. 85 (1961), seemed to indicate the possibility that certain investigative notes would have to be retained. The Criminal Division interpreted that decision as not requiring the retention of rough notes later transcribed into a finished interview report.

I checked on the current law and found that the decisions have confirmed the Department opinion. For example, <u>U.S. v. Terrell</u>, 474 F2d 872 (2d Cir. 1973), holds that the Jencks Act does not require law enforcement officers to retain rough notes when the contents of their notes are incorporated in official interview reports.

On October 29, 1974, I spoke with SA Mahan of Washington Field Office, and advised him of the request received from Miss Volner, and asked when he anticipated being called as a witness. SA Mahan said that while he was originally scheduled to be called at the end of November, he now expects to be called next week, November 4th through 8, 1974. I told Mr. Mahan that we were preparing an appropriate response for Miss Volner and that he would be notified.

I had prepared a clean copy of the Department's instructions concerning this matter and it is my opinion that the best way to protect the Bureau's interests here is to send a letter to Miss Volner explaining our policy and attaching a copy of the Department's instructions. Therefore, attached is a proposed letter to Miss Volner with a copy of the Department instructions attached.
