

HAZEL MINES, Supervisor, Janitorial Staff, Howard Johnson's Motor Lodge, 2601 Virginia Avenue, N. W., Washington, D. C., furnished the following information:

She is in charge of all the maids who clean the rooms at the Motel. In the event that one or more of the maids do not report for work, she herself often cleans guest rooms. During several weeks during the month of May, 1972, the maid who cleaned the rooms on the fourth floor was sick and did not report for work. During this time she cleaned the rooms on that floor including town 41 and she often had convergations with like occupant of that room. She advised that the individual who occupied room 419 stayed in the room most of the time during the day and in conversation with her stated that he worked at night. However, he would not state the nature of his business. Her office is on the fourth floor, down the hall from room 419 and she often ran into him in the hall of the Motel.

During the latter part of May, 1972, this individual moved from room 419 to room 723. When she asked him why he was moving to the seventh floor, he stated that he wanted to avoid all the women who were bothering him all the time. She got the impression that he was joking the way he made this statement.

After this individual moved to room 723, she had occasion to be in the room only on a couple of occasions. She recalled seeing a wad of papers on the desk during one of these visits.

Major General LEIGH WADE, United States Air Force (Retired), 3065 Cleveland Avenue, N.W., Washington, D.C., furnished the following information:

He served in Cuba during World War II with the United States Army Air Force and was the ranking American officer in Cuba during the war. He was personally acquainted with FULGENCIO BATISTA and with all of the high ranking military officers in the Guban army at that time. - Many of the officers who were serving in Cuba at that time with the Cubana army are now in this country and associated with groups who are working in this country to overthrow FIDEL CASTRO

He recalled that near the close of World War II young officer named BERNARD L. BARKER was assigned to his command in Cuba. He saw BARKER after the war in approximately 1962 in Washington, D.C., when BAKKER was staying at the Shoreham Hotel.

He stated

that since this luncheon engagement in Washington, D.C., approximately 10 years ago, he has had no personal contact with BARKER. However, he did exchange Christmas cards with BARKER until 1969. He advised that BARKER's wife's name is CLAIKE and that the last address he had for the BARKERS was 3623 Northwest 57th Street, Miami, Florida. His best recollection is that BARKER most recently was employed as promoter of boxing matches in Miami. He further stated that during World War II in Cuba, BARKER had also promoted boxing matches.

WADE stated that he did not know why BARKER would have his name in an address book since he has had no personal contact with BARKER for ten years. He advised that well known among the Cuban exiles in this country and that it is possible that BARKER maintained his name in his address book

Mr. GLENN J. SEDAM, JR., General Counsel for the Committee for Re-Election of the President, Committee Headquarters, 1701 Pennsylvania Avenue, N.W., furnished the following information:

During the late Fell or early Winter of 1971, Mr.

JAMES WALTER McCORD, JR., had learned that he (SEDAM) had been inquiring for someone to do part-time yard work at SEDAM's residence. SEDAM stated he had made the initial inquiry to a retired Navy chief, who was then employed by the Republican Organization. SEDAM stated he had made specific inquiry concerning the services of a reliable and honest person.

JAMES McCORD had learned of SEDAM's inquiries and appraoched Mr. SEDAM stating that he had "just the man for him' advising that he was one of his (McCORD's) students at Montgomery Junior College.

After several months, Mr. SEDAM actually employed the services of the person recommended by McCORD, and advised he was known to him as JUAN RUIZ, who claimed to be a Chilean national and former member of a police department in Chile. She has been trying to recall more information regarding the individual who occupied rooms 419 and 123 of the motel during May and June, since being contacted a scents of the FBI on June 19, 1972. She recalled that from approximately May 5, 1972, to May 11, 1972, the foom was vacant and unoccupied when she checked it each morning to detains if it needed to be cleaned. When she checked with the room desk to see if the room should be listed as vacant or as occupied, she was told that a \$200.00 deposit had been placed on the room and that it was rented, even though it was not occupied. She advised that she had checked the cleaning charts from May, 1972, which did reflect that that room was not occupied from May 5, 1972, through May 10, 1972.

On May 11, 1972, she noted that an individual had occupied room 419. She stated that she specifically recalls seeing an individual in that room because that room is on the same floor as her office and she spends quite a bit of her time on the fourth floor. At about 3:00 p.m., on May 11, 1972, she telephoned room 419 to inquire if the occupant wished to have the room cleaned. No one answered the telephone when she called, but several minutes later the occupant of the room met her in the hall. She told him that she had called and asked if he wanted to have the room cleaned. He said, "I fooled you by not answering. I thought it was one of my women." She assumed that he was just kidding her and told him that she would send one of the maids to clean the room. This individual remained in the room while the maid cleaned it.

During the time that this individual occupied room 419 she had occasion to speak with him almost daily. She stated that he was very friendly and outgoing and that he told her that

ROBERT SCHREIBER, 2911 Arizona Avenue, N.W., Washington, D.C. (WDC), furnished the following information:

He was employed as a day shift desk clerk at the Howard Johnson's Motor Lodge, 2601 Virginia Avenue, N.W., WDC, until June 15, 1972, at which time he voluntarily left the employ of the motel.

Upon reading the "The Washington Post", dated June 19, 1972, concerning the men arrested in the Watergate Office Buidling on June 17, 1972, he recognized the photograph of the men arrested, JAMES MC CORD as an individual who had not a room at the Howard Johnson's Motel in late April of 1972.

He related that approximately April 20, 1972, JAMES MC CORD approached him at the desk at the Howard Johnson's Motor Lodge and stated that he wished to rent a room for approximately ten days to be used for business meetings for his company, McCord Associates. SCHREIBER explained to him that the motel did not have any vacancies due to the fact that various colleges and universities were holding functions in the area. MC CORD stated that he would leave a deposit for any room that he reserved and also told SCHREIBER that he wanted a room on a high floor. SCHREIBER stated that the motel has eight floors. He gave MC CORD a group of keys to various rooms and MC CORD went upstairs to pick out a room. He returned to the desk and said he would take Room 619. He gave SCHREIBER two one hundred dollar bills as a deposit on the room and stated that he would return approximately April 29, 1972, to begin occupying the room. SCHREIBER stated that he recalls that the one hundred dollar bills were not new bills.

He continued that in approximately April 26 or 27, MC CORD returned to the motel and picked up the keys to the room.

Sometime during the second week in May, 1972, MC CORD paid \$300 more to cover the charges on the room he had rented. He made the payment in cash using three one hundred dollar bills.



FRANK WILLS, Security Guard, General Security Services, Incorporated, 1254 23rd Street, N.W., Washington, D.C. (WDC), residence 3128 22nd Street, N.W., telephone 833-3128, was interviewed at his place of employment and provided the following information:

He is assigned to the Security Force of the Watergate Office Building, 2600 Virginia Avenue, N.W., and regularly works the mid-night to 8:00 a.m. shift.

On Friday night, June 16, 1972, he came to work at 11:45 p.m. and immediately began a check of the doors on the basement level of the building. He explained this check at the beginning of his shift is more or less standard procedure.

On Level B-2 he found the two stairway doors, which entered from the garage into the building, taped with strong packing tape so the lock would not engage. These doors were supposed to be locked so he removed the tape from both doors. He did not give much consideration to the tape being there since occasionally in the past he had found tape on various doors left by janitors or engineers who work in the building.

He then walked down the stairway to Level B-3 and found the first door locked. The second door was unlocked, but not taped. He checked two more doors on Level B-3 and found them locked. He then checked B-1 Level door which was locked, went to the lobby desk and took the tape which he had removed and placed it on the desk.

Approximately ten minutes later he decided to make another check of these doors just to be sure and returned to the B-2 Level. He found the same two doors from which he had removed the tape previously retaped. At this time he left the tape in

place and went to Level B-3. Both doors leading to the garage area from the building were also taped, so he immediately took the elevator to the lobby. At the lobby desk, he called the Second District, Metropolitan Police Department, through the hotel operator and related the above facts. The time of this call to the Police Department have been between 12:15 a.m. and 12:30 a.m., Saturday morning.

Two officers arrived approximately 15 minutes later at the loby and he accompanied them to the 8th floor of the building to begin a floor by floor check of the building. As they checked the stairway door leading to the 6th floor corridor they found the latch taped.

Just as the tape was discovered someone rang the elevator bell which is a signal for him to unlock the lobby door for employees leaving the building. As he let these people out, he was met by more police officers and from them he first learned that someone had been arrested on the 6th floor.

He then accompanied these officers, numbering 10 to 15, on the elevator to the 5th floor and up the stairway to the 6th floor. He entered the Democratic National Committee office with these officers and observed five individuals hand-cuffed against the wall.

He then asisted in the search of the office of the Democratic National Committee and observed electronic equipment stacked up in the middle of the floor of one of the offices. Some officers soon began carrying this equipment down the stair to the elevator on the 5th floor and then to the lobby.

Once in the lobby, again more police officers were arriving and he returned to the 6th floor with a new group. This time he observed file cabinets and desk drawers had been pulled out and Metropolitan Police Department fingerprint men were processing them. He noticed two panels had been removed from the calling of one of the offices, but did not think anything about it at that time. He next spent approximately one to two hours searching various offices for the home telephone number of someone from the Democratic National Committee to

notify. Finally one of the officers called the Deputy Chairman of the Democratic National Committee who appeared approximately a half an hour after the call.

Miss HOBACK stated the only persons hired as security guards by Mr. JAMES WALTER McCORD, JR., who were not on the actual payroll of the committee but were paid by McCord Associates, were listed as BEL SHEA and RON HOWARD. She advised McCord Associates would furnish a billing to the committee listing the hourly wages of SHEA and HOMARD and the committee in turn would pay McCord Associates.

All other persons hired by McCord Associates were listed on the committee payroll and she would make the list available on June 26, 1972.


He last talked with MC CORD approximately three weeks ago regarding IC CORD's receipt of a crank letter. They discussed the contents of the letter and he in turn referred MC CORD to the appropriate division of the United States Secret Service to follow through with any investigation that was warranted. He last saw MC CORD one to two months ago, but did not recall the purpose of the meeting. He advised that since he and MC CORD do not a ssociate together socially, it must have been in regard to some technical matter of mutual interest in view of MC CORD's position as Security Director of the Committee to Re-Elect the President.

He did recommend MC CORD for the position of Security Director of the Committee to Re-Elect the President in a hallway conversation several months ago. On that day he ran into a Special Assistant to the President by the name of CAULFIELD, who asked him if he knew anyone for the position of Director of Security for the Committee to Re-Elect the President. At that time he hastily replied "Try MC CORD". That was the extent of his recommendation.

After MC CORD was hired, he and MC CORD had infrequent contact regarding technical matters. The only time the Republican National Convention came up in their discussions was on one occasion when MC CORD stated he would see him (WONG) at the Convention in San Diego.

Mr. WONG was not at all acquainted with EVERETTE HOWARD HUNT, JR., and the only time he may have seen HUNT's name would have been either on an address list or a security pass list.

Mr. WONG viewed a group of color photographs of white males, including that all of TIDECLARD MUNT, JD., but did not recoming and the seminary of the color balls in these photographs.

As of January 1, 1972, Mr. MC CORD was paid an annual salary wage of \$20,000 as Chief of Security, Mr. MC CORD was hired on an individual basis rather than hiring the services of McCord Associates of Rockville, Maryland, and his official title was Security Advisor.

Mr. ODLE stated that Mr. MC CORD was selected from a number of applicants and that MC CORD had previously retired from the Central Intelligence Agency. Mr. MC CORD's job was to set up security and coordinate the guard force for the Committee to Re-elect the President and as Security Officer MC CORD recruited guards and some drivers for the organization. These individuals were paid on an hourly basis by money which was allotted to MC CORD separate from his per annum salary. Xu

Mr. ODLE advised that he had seen the newspaper account of the break-in at the Democratic Committee Headquarters at the Watergate and advised that he had no know-| ledge of this incident and that he knew none of the names olof the persons arrested with Mr. MC CORD. He stated that the only time Mr. MC CORD had gone to Florida was when he went down to look at the convention center in Niami regarding accommpations and security. MC CORD looked at the Durral Ha Hotel while he was in Miami where he would have stayed and his travel dates to and from Miami ranged from June 6, 1972 to June 8, 1972, when he returned to Washington. Mr. ODLE advised that if Mr. MC CORD had remained with the Committee to Re-elect the President his employment would have lasted until approximately the end of November or December, 1972.

Mr. NOCITA indicated that he currently served as a member of the resident's Office of Emergency Preparedness (OEP), or 1/1 State No. 1. Hashington, D. C. In that capacity, he significant was Program Coordinator for SAD.

He noted, however, that a voluntary code of press censorship has been established by the media for possible use in future emergency situation. This code requires purely voluntary participation on the part of the press.

NOCITA noted that SAD is a Tri-Service Unit composed of five members from the Army, Navy, and Air Force. 



This appears again to have been done by employees of the Democratic National Committee to go back and forth between the 6th and 5th floors without taking the elevator.

On May 29, 1972, one of the security guards, LEROY C. BROWN, discovered the lock on the door to the Democratic National Committee offices, 2600 Virginia Avenue, N.W., had been tempered with and subsequently notified his office in the Second District, Metropolitan Police Department (MPD).

The police responded, dusted for fingerprints and notified Mr. ERIC JAFFE of the Democratic National Committee. Mr. JAFFE determined that the door was still locked and nothing was missing from the office area. On the door there were found marks from a wrench type apparatus by which an unsuccessful attempt had been made to unscrew the lock assembly.

After the investigating officers completed their investigation, one of the building engineers found a key which could be inserted in the front door lock, but would not lock or unlock the door to the office. He found this key in the cigarette recepticle in the hallway next to the elevators on the 6th floor. The MPD was subsequently notified and advised Mr. MC GILLICUDDY to preserve the key for future reference if another attempt was made to enter the office. This key was turned over to the interviewing agent in connection with the Democratic National Committee burglary.

The frequencies were issued to McCord Associates and authorization stought in the sequipment utilizing the approved frequencies.

Mr. MC KINNEY said that "FCC has no knowledge the radios were used" but stated that any use of them by individuals other than the prescribed uses as set forth in the authorization from FCC would constitute a violation of Title 47, CFR Section 9583 (a2). In essence Mr. MC KINNEY stated that this law forbids the use of the equipment which involves activity contrary to local state or federal law.

Mr MC KINNEY advised that the records of FCC further reflect that McCord Associates Incorporated are authorized to have two citizens Class D radio units that call letters KEPO141 and that this authorization was instituted December 8, 1971 to extend up until December 8, 1976. Class D radio service is available to any citizen over 18 years of age and he added that McCord Associates Incorporated has applied for additional authority to maintain an increase in the number of Class D radio units above the two they presently hold.
