Sir, I have thought about what I am about to say in this letter and I have realized that if I were in your position and received this letter that I might not believe it either. All that I can ask you to do sir is to read this with an open mind and to think about what if it is true.

~~My~~ My name is [redacted] My first question is have you ever heard my name as it concerns Miss Whitney Houston. I hope that the answer is yes but probably the answer is no. Now I will go on with the rest of this letter.

Over the last 17 months I have sent, including notes, 66 letters to Miss Whitney. I have also sent 2 letters to [redacted]

[redacted] 6 to Mr. Houston, 1 to Miss [redacted] and 4 to Miss [redacted]. 5 of the letters to Mr. Houston have been included in packages ~~of~~ of copies of letters that I have been sending to Mr. Houston so that he can give the copies to his daughter. I have met Mr. Houston twice and the second time, at Madison Sq. Garden on Sept. 4, he agreed to take a package of 37 copies of letters to his daughter and to give them to her. He also said that I could send him copies of any more letters and he would give them to her. I also sent a hugable Toy Kitty named Mope to her. ~~There is a~~

I have been to 9 of Miss Whitney's concerts

and have tried to give her flowers twice at the concerts. Miss Whitney is the first lady that I have ever given flowers to. ^(I am not a love struck kid, I am 28 years old, a former combat engineer sergeant and I am now a political activist.)

When I first fell in love with Miss Whitney I tried to ignore what I felt towards her. After 5 months I had to do something and so I started writing letters. I have tried to stop writing the letters and to give up twice but after a few weeks I had to start writing again. I just have to keep trying.

I should have said this at the beginning of this letter. I am in love with Miss Whitney Houston. I have been in love with her since March of 1986. I think that Miss Whitney is the prettiest, the loveliest and the most beautiful lady that there is. I have tried to forget what I feel towards her a few times. I have gotten mad at her a few times, a few of the letters have not been very nice. I have gotten so mad ^{and desperate} that twice I have decided to send copies of the letters to some of those smit trash things like the enquirer so that ~~so~~ since she would not answer me in private then she could answer me in public. I am not, very simply not going to do that. I found out about [redacted] and she does not need anything like that to happen, it would not do her any good at all. But because I have gotten that desperate and mad and would come up with ideas that that, it scares me that I might come up with some crazy or stupid or really ~~very~~ dumb idea that might be as bad as that or even worse

than that. I might hurt someone with some crazy
idea and not realize how stupid an idea it
is until after I have done it. That really scares
me. [REDACTED]

Mr. [REDACTED] can you help me. Can you call
me and talk to me or in some way find out
from Miss Whitney if she is getting my letters
or not and let me know. Mr. Houston has never
responded to the ~~two~~ packages of letters that I have
sent him or let me know what happened the the
package of 37 letters that I gave him on Sept. 9.
I still do not know for sure if Miss Whitney
has ever even seen even one of my letters. The
only thing that I have ever gotten back is two
newsletters ~~each~~ each with a picture of Miss
Whitney. The newsletters say ~~she~~ thanks for
liking Whitney's music and that she cannot
respond to each and every letter and then tells
me how to buy teeshirts. That is all that
I have ever gotten back. I am getting very
desperate to get some sort of response.

Please Mr. [REDACTED] do not ignore this
letter. Please if you do not believe me can you
think about what it means if I am telling the truth.

I just cannot think of much to say to you that I have not said already in my other letters except maybe to start telling you about myself. I have told you a little about myself in a few of my previous 28 letters but I am not sure what to tell you so I guess I will just start telling you anything I can think of.

I am not very good with people, I am not good at becoming friends with people. I guess most people might consider me to be sort of a loner.

I like children and small animals, sometimes I will just sit and watch children playing or I will watch birds or squirrels as they hunt for food. I live sort of across a street from a playground and sometimes I will just sit and watch the little kids play.

I work as a [redacted]. The main thing that I work for is for real [redacted] in this country. As I stated in one of my previous letters, you might not think much of me for that but I never explained why, so I will try to explain that now. I have been sort of afraid or scared to explain this to you but I think I have to at some point in time. The explanation may be long but I want to explain fully.

What I am working for, is for a fair, just, progressive [redacted] based on ability to pay that every American can trust, understand and believe in. I want to cut every person who does not make enough money to live at an acceptable level, totally out of the tax system so that they pay no income tax, social security (FICA) tax and no health care cost. I want to balance the federal budget and to have a national health care system. If we do not have some sort of national health care system then we are

going to be denying people health care if they can not afford it. If we cannot provide people and most of all our children decent health care in the richest nation on this planet then we have failed as a nation and failed as a nation.

Someone is going to have to pay for all that. That someone is the rich, the people who can afford to pay. We can not keep asking our children to pay for what we have now. We have got to pay for it all now, as we go. I believe that even if the rich people of this nation paid very high rates on their upper levels of income that they would still live better than over 99% of the people on this planet and that if someone wants more than that then they should go and study the teachings of an individual by the name of Jesus and they might learn something. If someone has to pay it should be the people who can pay. It should not be the poor who can barely feed their children and it should not be our children paying for what we have now. They will have their own problems, they do not need to pay for ours too.

Someone has to pay that, and I have seen a lot of people put a lot of importance on money when I have never really understood why. I guess I should get the point of all this explanation.

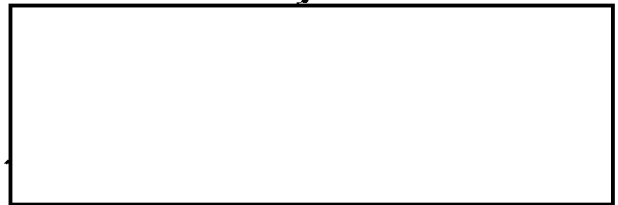

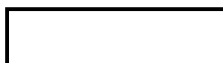

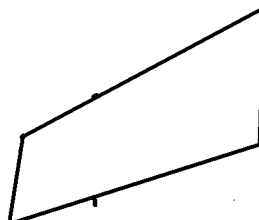

The purpose of this letter is to confirm a conversation that occurred on June 8, 1988, between Assistant United States Attorney (AUSA) [redacted] and Special Agent (SA) [redacted]

During this conversation, SA [redacted] advised AUSA [redacted] that [redacted] of [redacted] Vermont had been writing numerous letters to singer Whitney Houston and members of her family. The text of these letters expressed Mr. [redacted] love for Miss Houston. One of these letters, written to [redacted] Houston's [redacted] stated, "I might hurt someone with some crazy idea...". Mr. [redacted] was interviewed on June 8, 1988, and he advised that he had no intention of threatening or harming Houston or her family and friends. The intent of the letter to [redacted] was to elicit a response from Houston. The line in question referred to his considering making his love for Houston public through the "National Enquirer" or on "The Phil Donahue Show". He believed this "crazy idea" would have hurt Houston's reputation, so he decided not to follow through on it.

For the information of the Bureau, on 6/8/88 [REDACTED] of [REDACTED] Vermont, telephone number [REDACTED] was interviewed at his residence. [REDACTED] resides in a small, cluttered one-room apartment located behind the [REDACTED] Police Department. [REDACTED] advised that he is unemployed, however he works as a [REDACTED]. He currently has a civil suit pending in US Court of Appeals, [REDACTED] in which he is suing the US Government for [REDACTED]. He advised that he has no criminal record and does not own a car or possess a driver's license. [REDACTED] has admitted to writing 79 letters to WHITNEY HOUSTON and 16 letters to her family, friends and business associates, including one to her [REDACTED]. He advised that he had no intention of threatening HOUSTON or anyone else with physical harm. He admits to being deeply in love with HOUSTON, and has been frustrated because she has not responded to his letters. He believes that if he makes his love for HOUSTON public through "a crazy idea" like going on the PHIL DONAHUE SHOW it would hurt her reputation, therefore, because of his love for her, he does not intend to do this.

[] further advised that he still hopes that HOUSTON will respond to his letters, so he plans to continue writing to her. He also plans to continue seeing her concerts (he has seen her 9 times in concert), but he has not caused any trouble in the past nor does he plan to do so in the future.

In conversation with [] it was apparent that he is obsessed with WHITNEY HOUSTON. It was also apparent that he exerts a lot of energy towards addressing [] issues of interest to him. He did not appear to interact well socially with the interviewing Agent in that he was very uncomfortable. He is best described as being a loner.

On 6/9/88, [] Records Clerk, [] Police Department, [] Vermont, advised that a review of [] Police Department records revealed that on 11/20/86 the [] Police Department responded to a complaint concerning a disturbance created by []. No charges were filed in this case, however. In March, 1986, he saw WHITNEY HOUSTON for the first time and, even though it did not make much sense and for some reason he did not understand, he fell in love with her. He tried to ignore these feelings, however, on August 18, 1986, he decided to write to Miss HOUSTON to express his feelings to her. Since that date, he has written 79 letters to Miss HOUSTON and 16 letters to members of her family and friends. Six letters have been sent to her father, [redacted] five to her [redacted] [redacted] one to [redacted], one to [redacted] and one to her cats. His purpose for writing to HOUSTON's friends and family was to try to find out what had happened to the letters he had sent to HOUSTON. He has kept copies of each letter he sent to HOUSTON and her family as proof to others that he had done so. He made copies of these letters at KINKO'S COPY SHOP, [redacted] Vermont. The copies of these letters were kept in his safe deposit box at THE HOWARD BANK, Main Street, [redacted] Vermont. The letters were kept in the safe deposit box because his apartment had been broken into approximately one year ago and he was afraid the letters would be taken.

[redacted] further advised that he has seen HOUSTON in concert on nine occasions and has met her father at one of these concerts at Madison Square Garden on September 9, 1987. He approached her father and gave him a package containing 37-38 photocopies of letters he had previously sent to Miss HOUSTON. Her father agreed to give the letters to his daughter. To date, he has only received two photographs of Miss HOUSTON and two newsletters.

The interviewing Agent observed one of these photographs tacked to the wall next to [REDACTED] bed.

[REDACTED] was shown a photocopy of a letter addressed to [REDACTED]. He identified it as a copy of the letter he had sent to [REDACTED]. He advised that the line on page 3 of this letter which read, "I might hurt someone with some crazy idea...", was not meant as a threat of physical harm to anyone. What was meant by this line was that in his frustrated attempts to get HOUSTON to respond to his letters he considered contacting the "National Enquirer" and similar-type tabloids or [REDACTED] in order to make his love for HOUSTON public. He considered this to be a crazy idea because in attempting to get a response from HOUSTON by these methods he could have hurt her reputation.

[REDACTED] stated that he has never considered threatening or harming HOUSTON or anyone else. He has tried to stop writing to HOUSTON on several occasions, but has been unable to do it permanently. He intends to continue writing to HOUSTON and attend her concerts in an effort to get her to respond to his letters. He advised that he has never made any trouble at previous concerts, and does not intend to do so in the future.

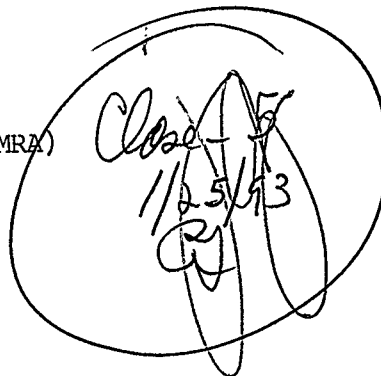
