This concerns a boarding incident which took place 12/13/72, wherein Wilt Chamberlain, Los Angeles Lakerbasketball team star, made inflammatory remarks prior to boarding a Trans World Airlines (TWA) flight on route from Chicago, Illinois, to Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. remarks were brought about after a lenghthy plane delay, and the passengers being subjected to a pre-boarding screening by Customs Security Officers. Customs Air Security Supervisor told Officers at gate no violation and to advise TWA officials of remarks and verify that TWA did not regard remarks as threat to aircraft. TWA Passenger's Service representative on scene advised and requested to speak with Chamberlain and Laker's coach relative to the remarks he had made. Chamberlain, when confronted in jetway, became belligerent, used profane and obscene language and left the boarding area. Chamberlain subsequently flew to Philadelphia via United Airlines. U. S. Customs did not notify Chicago Office at time of incident since they did not consider remarks possible violation. were no Bureau Agents present at time of incident. FAA aware of incident. Chicago Office instructed to present facts to United States Attorney, Chicago, Illinois, for prosecutive opinion.

Informant stated favorite was Philadelphia and 5 points and that on evening of game, game was "off the board" in Boston; however, Boston book-makers "in the know" were keeping bets on the Celtics. 172-19-2"


