Pittsburgh, Pa. (conceal identity by request - has furnished reliable information in the past), furnished SA WISEMAN the following information concerning the Nuclear Materials and Equipment Corp., North 7th and Warren Avenue, Apollo, Pa.:

The Nuclear Materials and Equipment Corp., was incorporated in Pennsylvania on 12/31/56, and is located at Apollo, Pa., 33 miles northwest of Pittsburgh. The plant contains a bridge crane and railway spars and compresses about 55,000 square feet of laboratory and production area. The company also occupies a modern 25,000 square foot facility in Parks Township, Pa., and is fully equipped handling work on intensly radioactive materials.

The functions and services of the Nuclear Materials and Equipment Corp., are as follows:

Products: Produces, melts, fabricates and recovers a variety of special materials which are used primarily, although not exclusively in the nuclear power industry. These materials include particularly the metals, alloys and compounds required for nuclear fuel and control purposes. Not only are materials manufactured but also used in the production and testing of materials and other special services:

- l. Fuel Materials: Manufactured items include alloys such as uranium, zirconium, uranium-aichium and uranium-aluminum. In addition, prepares special uranium oxides of the proper size and other physical characteristics required for the manufacture of aluminum and stainless steel dispersion elements. Also products thorium and its alloys, manufactures plutonium fuel alloys. Company not only prepares raw materials, alloys and compounds, but also machines them and pelletizes them into required sizes and shapes.



to DOWD, upon receipt of the above memorandum, the AEC, New York took no action and, in fact, no other information concerning ISORAD was available in the files of the AEC, NYC.

A review of the AEC inspection file revealed an AEC inspection report dated 7/2/64 of the NUMEC, Administration Building and Uranium Plants, Apollo, Pennsylvania. This report is classified "Secret".

This report states in part that "NUMEC is a sales agent for the Government of Israel through its Minister of Defense, Division of Supplies, 830 Third Avenue, New York 22, New York.

"In this connection NUMEC has an arrangement with the Israeli Atomic Energy Commission to do biological work in insect control; and assist in establishing facilities for the irradiation and preservation of citrus fruits. NUMEC has a proposal pending with the Israeli Government for the design, construction and operation of facilities for irradiation and preservation of foodstuffs in various parts of the world. This latter proposal, if approved, will result in NUMEC and the Israeli AEC sharing on a fifty-fifty basis the corporate facilities so constructed. NUMEC has a contract with the Israeli AEC for the general development of plutonium oxide as fuel elements in nuclear reactors.

"NUMEC has a contract with Chemical and Phosphates Limited, Post Office Box 1428, Haifa, Israel, for calciumzirconium production. This contract also involves a joint program in food irradiation."

It may be noted that this inspection report also states that NUMEC has a contract with Japanese atomic firms and also contracts with the Australian Government to supply that government 330 plutonium-aluminum fuel elements.

This inspection report stated that NUMEC actively participates with foreign companies and foreign governments in the field of civil nuclear energy. Further, NUMEC performs

a wide range of classified and unclassified work for the AEC under various prime contracts and purchase orders.

This inspection report also pointed out that located in the Administration Building of NUMEC, Apollo, Pennsylvania, is the NUMEC Instruments and Controls Corporation (NUMINCO), a firm established to manufacture and market nuclear instruments and processes control equipment. NUMINCO, according to this report, is owned by the Societe d'Applications Industrielles de la Physique, Paris, France; by NUMEC and by a group of private investors each having about one-third interest. This commercial enterprise, according to this inspection report, is completely divorced from NUMEC's AEC interests either classified or unclassified.

The above information taken from the AEC inspection report and classified "Secret" as noted above, is being set forth for the information of the Pittsburgh Division

The Nuclear Materials and Equipment Corporation, was incorporated in Pennsylvania on December 31, 1956, and is located at Apollo, Pa., 33 miles northwest of Pittsburgh. The plant contains a bridge crane and railway spur and comprises about 55,000 square feet of laboratory and production area. The company also occupies a modern 25,000 square foot facility in Parks Township, Pa., and is fully equipped for handling work on intensely radioactive materials.

The functions and services of the Nuclear Materials and Equipment Corporation are as follows:

Products: Produces, melts, fabricates and recovers a variety of special materials which are used primarily, although not exclusively, in the nuclear power industry. These materials include particularly the metals, alloys and compounds required for nuclear fuel and control purposes. Not only are materials manufactured but are also used in the production and testing of materials and other special services:

Fuel Materials: Manufactured items include alloys such as uranium, zirconium, uranium-aichium and uraniumaluminum. In addition, prepares special uranium oxides of the proper size and other physical characteristics required for the manufacture of aluminum and stainless steel dispersion elements. Also produces thorium and its alloys, manufactures plutonium fuel alloys. Company not only prepares raw materials, alloys and compounds, but also machines them and pelletizes them into required sizes and shapes.

"In this connection Numec has an arrangement with the Israeli Atomic Energy Commission to do biological work in insect control; and assist in establishing facilities for the irradiation and preservation of citrus fruits. Numec has a proposal pending with the Israeli Government for the design, construction and operation of facilities for irradiation and preservation of foodstuffs in various parts of the world. This latter proposal, if approved, will result in Numec and the Israeli AEC sharing on a fifty-fifty basis the corporate facilities so constructed. Numec has a contract with the Israeli AEC for the general development of plutonium oxide as fuel elements in nuclear reactors.

"Numec has a contract with Chemical and Phosphates Limited, Post Office Box 1428, Haifa, Israel, for calcium-zirconium production. This contract also involves a joint program in food irradiation."

The inspection report also states that Numec has a contract with Japanese atomic firms and also contracts with the Australian Government to supply that government 330 plutonium-aluminum fuel elements.

The inspection report further states that Numec fine 12 actively participates with foreign companies and foreign unclus Governments in the field of civil nuclear energy. Further, pur 10 k Numec performs a wide range of classified and unclassified work for the AEC under various prime contracts and purchase orders.

The report also stated that located in the Administration Building of Numec, Apollo, Pa., is the Numec Instruments and Controls Corporation (NUMINCO), a firm established to manufacture and market nuclear instruments and process control equipment. NUMINCO, according to this report, is owned by the Societe & Applications Industrielles de la Physique, Paris, France, by Numed and by a group of private investors, each having about one-third interest. This commercial enterprise, according to this report, is completely divorced from Numec's AEC interests, either classified or unclassified.

VI. MISCELLANEOUS

On February 7, 1949, ZALMAN MORDECAI SHAPIRO executed a Personnel Security Questionnaire for the AEC on which he indicated that he was a member of the Independent Citizens Committee of the Arts, Sciences and Professions in 1946 - 47.







Liaison has been following with the Attonic Energy Commission (AEC) regarding the captioned matter which the Bureau declined to accept for investigation in February, 1966, in view of the lack of any indication of violation of a law within the Bureau's jurisdiction and because AEC had already made extensive internal checks. The situation appeared to involve sloppy management of nuclear materials by NUMEC, an AEC subcontractor. AEC had

said that it felt inquiry by FBI was not warranted but before making more penetrative checks it felt FBI should be consulted to see if it desired to assume investigation.

Enclosed is a copy of a letter dated |5/18/66, from AEC to the Joint Committee on Atomic Energy. This was furnished by Mr. Paul Gaughran of AEC as a matter of information since it reports that additional investigative action by AEC has disclosed no evidence of theft or diversion

Pittsburgh, Pa., was advised by SA DONALD F. WISEMAN that he did not have to make a statement, and that any statements that he made must be voluntary and could be used against him in a court of law. He was also advised that he had the opportunity to consult with an attorney prior to making any statements.

Br. SHAPIRO advised that he was born May 12, 1920, at Canton, Chio, and furnished the following information:

He is the President of Muclear Materials and Equipment Corporation (NUMEC), Apollo, Pa. Approximately one year ago his company and the Government of Israel formed a company known as the Israel Numec Isotopes and Radiation Enterprises (ISORAD), Limited, on a partnership basis. NUMEC contributed one-third equity value and obtained 50% of the stock in ISORAD, and the Government of Israel owned the other 50% of the outstanding stock. The Board of Directors of ISORAD consisted of eight members, including four individuals appointed by NUMBC and four members appointed by the Israeli Government. Dr. SHAPIRO currently serves as Chairman of the Board of Directors of ISCRAD. The other three members of the Board appointed by NUMBC and who are presently serving on the Board, are Pittsburgh area businessmen; namely, LEON VALE, President of a Pittsburgh re-development center; BENJAMIN ROSEN, prominent Pittsburgh realtor, and PHILLIP POWERS, past President of Western Pennsylvania Power Company who presently serves as Assistant Chairman of ISORAD.

The four Board members representing the Israeli Government occupy responsible positions in Israel, including the head of the Israel Atomic Energy Commission, head of the Research Branch of the Israel Atomic Energy Commission, and head of the Citrus Beard of the Israeli Government, as well as a prominent Israeli banker. The last ISORAD Board meeting was held during October, 1965, and was attended by all the American Board members.

Lengthy negotiations were undertaken by NUMEC with the Government of Israel for the purpose of organizing a company to undertake research in the field of atomic radiation. The radiation research was initiated with the hope that spoilage of citrus fruits in storage could be reduced by eradicating the bacteria which causes spoilage, and that irradiation would eliminate the transportation of live larvae of the Mediterranean fruit fly.

In addition to the citrus irradiation project, ISORAD is now engaged in research projects involving the irradiation of other agricultural products.

Prior to and subsequent to the formation of ISORAD, Dr. SHAPIRO and representatives of NUMEC discussed their plans relative to the organization of ISORAD with the United States Atomic Energy Commission, the Security Division of the Atomic Energy Commission, and with an individual of the United States Embassy in Israel, believed to be the United States Ambassador. Subsequent to the formation of ISORAD, news media in the United States were furnished details of the organization and plans of ISORAD.

As a result of his association with ISORAD, Dr. SHAPIRO has had business association with JOSEPH EYAL, Science Attache, Embassy of Israel, Washington, D. C., and the Purchasing Commission of the Israeli Government in New York City. In this connection, NUMEC has sold its manufactured products to the Government of Israel after securing a license from the Export Control Division of the United States Department of Commerce.

Dr. SHAPIRO has made every effort to comply with the laws of the United States in connection with his business venture with the Israeli Government. He stated that neither he nor NUMEC has registered with the Registration Section of the United States Department of Justice, Washington, D. C., considering NUMEC 's business association with the Israeli Government as a bona fide business venture. He stated that, in his opinion, he has never operated or served as an agent of the Israeli Government or any other government. His records of shipments with the Department of Commerce are open to inspection. He considered his company's association

with the Israeli Government and ISORAD as a bona fide business venture for the sole purpose of making a profit for NUMEC. His company prior to the formation of ISORAD had unsuccessfully attempted to establish business ventures with Spain and Germany.

He stated that he desired to immediately review the statutes concerning the Registration Act of 1948 for the purpose of determining if he or his company were violating the law in any manner whatsoever. He pointed out that he had never considered the possibility that he or his company were violating the law.







Investigation was instituted at the request of the Attorney General to establish the nature and extent of Zalman Mordecai Shapiro's relationship with the Government of This could be connected with, or in addition to, or as a result of, his association with Israeli officials and sympathizers in the United States.

On May 24, 1968, a source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised that Shapiro was born in 1920 and is married. He completed his formal education in 1948 and holds a B.A., M.A. and Ph.D. degree from Johns Hopkins University. He was a Research Associate at Johns Hopkins, 1942 - 1946. 1948, he was employed by Westinghouse Electric Corporation and continued with that organization until 1956. During his employment with Westinghouse, he was Supervisor of Zirconium Process Development; Manager, Physical Chemistry and Chemical Control; Manager, Chemical Metallurgy and Uranium Oxide Development; and Manager, Reactor Design, P.W.R. Core 2. Shapiro holds four patents on pure metals production and has seventeen patent disclosures pending. He is a member of the American Chemical Society and is Chief Executive Officer. He is also a member of A.A.A.S., A.S.M., A.S.M.E., and A.I.M.E. Life insurance in the amount of \$150,000 is carried on his life for the benefit of his business. He is Chairman of the Board of Numec Instrument and Controls Corporation, affiliate, Appollo, Pa.; and President of Nuclear Decontamination Corporation.

On May 24, 1968, Mrs. Jean Rodriguez, Receptionist, Credit Bureau, Inc., 415 Smithfield Street, Pittsburgh, Pa., advised that her records show that Dr. Zalman M. Shapiro and wife, Evelyn, have resided at Pittsburgh 17, Pa., and that Shapiro has been employed as the President of the Nuclear Materials Corporation, Warren and North 7th Avenues, Apollo, Pa., since 1956. She advised that her records further show that Shapiro was born in 1920, has four dependents, owns his home, and maintains a satisfactory credit rating with that bureau. Records indicate that the following business concerns have recently inquired concerning Shapiro's credit standing with that bureau: Commercial Bank and Trust Company, April 9, 1968; Gulf Oil Company, August, 1967; Maxine's Women's Dress Shop, October, 1966; and Peck Company, August, 1966.

On May 23, 1968, records of the Bureau of Motor Vehicles, Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, Harrisburg, Pa., revealed that two automobiles are currently registered to Zalman Shapiro number 8H34F117273, motor vehicle registration number 22171H, and a Buick sedan, motor number 484695H247222, motor vehicle registration number 22170H.

On May 24, 1968, above source advised that on April 14, 1967, stockholders of Nuclear Materials and Equipment Corporation (NUMEC) approved the company's acquisition by Atlantic-Richfield Company (Incorporated), Philadelphia, Pa. The acquisition by Atlantic-Richfield Company involved the exchange of .255 of a share of Atlantic-Richfield common stock for each NUMEC share outstanding. On April 17, 1967, the acquisition was consummated and on the same date, by charter amendment, the name of NUMEC was changed to N. M. E. Liquidating Corporation, Apollo, Pa. This liquidating corporation was formed for the purpose of meeting the outstanding obligations of NUMEC. Further, during 1967, a new Delaware corporation known as NUMEC was chartered to carry on the activities of the old Pennsylvania NUMEC. new Delaware corporation will operate as a direct and whollyowned subsidiary of Atlantic-Richfield Company (Incorporated), Philadelphia, Pa. It was believed that NUMEC under predecessor's control, sustained heavy financial and operating losses.



Source went on to advise that Dr. Frederick Forscher, Vice President, and Jack R. Newman, Secretary of NUMEC, both recently resigned.

On August 15, 1967, NUMEC established additional branch operations at Karthaus (Quehanna), Pa. This is a new plant, according to source, known as the Nuclear Radiation Process and Reactor Center, whose activities are currently being managed by Marty Stein and seven additional employees.

Source advised that as of April 17, 1968, no changes had occurred in the management of NUMEC (Delaware) and no information regarding NUMEC's current financial status was known.

The Atlantic-Richfield Company was incorporated in Pennsylvania on April 29, 1870, and acquired property Atlantic Oil Storage Company. For a complex network of companies and divisions, the Atlantic-Richfield Company developes oil and gas lands and leases and deals in all phases of purchase, sale, transportation and refining of crude oil. This company is known world-wide as a leader in its industry continues its activities on both a foreign and domestic source advised that inter-company relations between NUMBC and Atlantic-Richfield Company have not as yet been defined

Source advised that related companies include the

NUMEC Instrument and Controls Corporation (NUMINCO), 609 Warren Avenue, Apollo, Pa. This company is a Pennsylvania corporation chartered in October, 1961, having authorized capital consisting of 37,500 shares of preferred stock at \$4 per share, and 200,000 shares of common stock, no par value. NUMINCO is active as a marketing agent and sales representative for NUMEC.

Nuclear Decontaminating Corporation, North Warren, Apollo, Pa., shares facilities with NUMINCO. This company is a Pennsylvania corporation chartered June 23, 1959, having authorized capital consisting of 500 shares of stock at \$1 par value. Nuclear Decontaminating Corporation is engaged



in decontamination and laundering of clothing, equipment and other materials which come into contact with radioactivity.

company relations with NUMEC are confined to regular service and merchandise transactions on regular terms.

NUMEC (Delaware) now has branch activity at Lewiston, N. Y. The branch is located at 397 Pletcher Road, Model City, N.Y., although they utilize a mailing address of P.O. Box 306, Lewiston, N. Y. At that point, Niagara Division manufactures boron isotopes for the Atomic Energy Commission. The company operating as contractor performs work on cost-plus fee basis for the Government. The existing plant had been inactive for approximately four years and NUMEC prepared the plant for operation early in 1965. The company utilizes several cinder block buildings. Eventually, this company will have approximately 70 employees at Lewiston. Source advised that James C. McDiarmid is branch officer of this plant.

Source advised that NUMEC was incorporated in Pennsylvania on December 31, 1956, and is located at Apollo, Pa., east of Pittsburgh. The plant contains a bridge crane and railway spur and comprises about 55,000 square feet of laboratory and production area. The company also occupies a modern production area production area. The company also occupies a modern production area production

Source advised that at Parks Township, location of the Advance Materials Center, two additional structures have recently been completed to house the plutonium facilities and reactive metal fabrication facility, including a new 7,500 square foot building. An 8,000 square foot laundry building located in Apollo is occupied by Nuclear Decontamination Corporation, which is owned jointly by NUMEC and a large Pittsburgh industrial laundry concern. This company engages in rental and laundering of work clothing used in radioactive areas.



Source advised that the functions and services of NUMEC (Delaware), Apollo, Pa., are as follows:

Products: Produces, melts, fabricates and recovers a variety of special materials which are used primarily, although not exclusively, in the nuclear power industry. These materials include particularly the metals, alloys compounds required for nuclear fuel and control purposes. Not only are materials manufactured, but are also used in the production and testing of materials and other special services:

Fuel Materials: Manufactured items include a loys such as uranium, zirconium, uranium-aicbium and uranium-aluminum. In addition, prepares special uranium oxides of the proper size and other physical characteristics required for the manufacture of aluminum and stainless steel dispersion elements. Also produces thorium and its alloys, manufactures plutonium alloys. Company not only prepares raw materials, alloys and compounds, but also machines them and pelletizes them required sizes and shapes.

Neutron and Radioisotopic Heat Sources: Used for start-up of reactors and other industrial purposes (such as oil well logging).

Control Materials: The company manufactures and fabricates into finished control rods hafmiun, cadium-silver, copper-barem carbide and europium.

Specialized Equipment: Also manufactures specialized equipment used in the production and testing of materials, such as cathodic vacuum etchers; arc-melting vacuum, and special atmosphere furnaces; high-pressure inert gas purification units; high-vacuum valves; inert gas welding chambers and other specialized machinery and equipment.

Other Special Services: Derives revenues from chemical, analytical and metallurgical product evaluation, such as corrosion testing, spectrographic analysis and also isotopic assays.

To perform these functions and services, the corporation has a complete chemistry laboratory, including advanced mechanical and physical metallurgical equipment necessary for a well-rounded reactor materials research and development program. These laboratory facilities include complete wet analytical and instrumental facilities and a separate physical chemical laboratory equipped to undertake advanced physical chemical measurements involving high vacuum and high temperature techniques. An additional chemical engineering laboratory is engaged in development laboratory-scaled production activities in connection with scrap recovery, the production of materials such as uranium oxides and compounds and chemical separations.

In addition to the above activities, NUMEC (Delaware) has moved into the function of operating contractor, managing boron isotope separation facility for the Atomic Energy Commission. Also, designs and produces portable irradiators, and complete isotopic-powered electric generating systems for terrestrial applications.

Distribution sales are to industrials, the United States Atomic Energy Commission, universities, colleges, and atomic power laboratories. Various terms depending on product, but generally net 30 days, progress payments in some instances completion of job. As operating contractor, terms are costs plus fixed fee.

Source furnished the following background information concerning NUMEC (Delaware) officials:

Leonard P. Pepkowitz, Vice President, was born in 1916 and is married. He completed his formal education in holds a B.S. degree from the University of Minnesota; Ph.D. at Rutgers University. He was employed as Assistant Chemist of Rhode Island Experiment Station from 1943 to 1944; Chemist, Los Alamos Atomic Laboratory; 1945 - 1946, Group Leader, Analytical Chemistry, Los Alamos Atomic Laboratory. In was employed by Knolls Atomic Laboratory, and continued there until 1957, at which time he resigned. He served as Manager of Metallurgical and Chemical Analysis, and Manager of the Chemical Laboratory. He is author or co-author of over thirty papers and

scientific journals, as well as many classified publications. He is a member of the American Chemical Society, A.A.A.S., and New York Academy of Sciences. He is in charge of chemistry. Life insurance in the amount of \$100,000 is carried on his life for the benefit of the business. He is General Manager of the Niagara Division, a subsidiary of NUMEC.

Oscar S. Gray, Vice President - Treasurer, was born in He is single and became associated with the corporation on April 1, 1957. He graduated from Yale College and School and holds a B.A. degree and LL.B. degree. From 1951 until becoming associated with this organization, he was a member of the Legal Advisor's Office of the Department of State, Washington, D. C. He handles financial and legal matters for the Life insurance in the amount of \$100,000 is carried on his life for the benefit of the business. He is Secretary-Treasurer of NUMEC Instrument and Controls Corporation; and is Treasurer of Nuclear Decontamination Corporation, both subsidiaries of NUMEC.

Meredith S. Johnson, Controller and Assistant Treasurer, was born in He is married and is a 1951 graduate University of Pittsburgh with a B.S. degree in Business istration. He is a C.P.A. by profession. He formerly had been employed by Bachrach, Sanderbeck and Company, C.P.A.'s, Pa., and by United States Air Force from 1941 to 1945. In 1956, he became an officer of Magnetics, Inc., Butler, Pa., of electronic and magnetic materials and components. Was Vice-President and Treasurer of the corporation, to assume present office with NUMEC in December, 1964.

Source furnished the following background information concerning Frederick Forscher and Jack R. Newman, who recently resigned from NUMEC:

Frederick Forscher, formerly Vice-President of NUMEC, was born in 1918 and is married. He holds B.S. and M.S. degrees from Princeton University and earned his Ph.D. at Columbia University. He was assistant civil engineer at Princeton University, 1946 - 1947; Instructor, Mechanics and Material, Columbia University, 1947 - 1952; Supervisor, Mechanical Metallurgy, Westinghouse Electric Corporation, 1952 - 1957.

Jack R. Newman. formerly Secretary - General Counsel of NUMEC, was born in _____ is married and is a native of New York State. He is an attorney by profession and a member of the Bar of New York State. Newman is a graduate of Cornell University, School of Industrial and Labor Relations, and also a graduate of Columbia University Law School, Class of 1959. Prior to 1960, he was associated with General Counsel for the United States Atomic Energy Commission. Since 1960, Newman had been counsel for the Joint Congressional Committee on Atomic Energy. Newman served as a First Lieutenant in the United States Air Force from 1955 to 1957. He was elected to his present office about November 9, 1964.

On May 24, 1968, a Special Agent of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, in connection with another matter, obtained a copy of an incomplete brochure currently being prepared for distribution by NUMEC (Delaware), of Apollo, Pa. This brochure contains, in part, the following information:

In April (1968), Atlantic-Richfield entered the nuclear energy field by acquiring NUMEC of Apollo, Pa., and its 700 employees will operate as a wholly-owned subsidiary of Atlantic-Richfield under ARCO Chemical Company, continuing operations with its present management and staff.

Started in late 1956, NUMEC was the brain-child of men of vision who participated in the early development of the nuclear age, notably Dr. Zalman M. Shapiro, President, Dr. Frederick Forscher (deleted) and Leonard P. Pepkowitz.

The company is an important producer of nuclear fuels and other materials used in commercial nuclear power reactors. Such exotic elements as uranium, plutonium, thorium, hafnium and zirconium, most of which were only laboratory curiosities a quarter of a century ago, are used in company operations.

Working under rigid health and security regulations, the firm holds Atomic Energy Commission licenses for possessing, handling and processing nuclear materials. NUMEC also holds permits from the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania for radioactive waste disposal. The company is certified for storage of classified documents.

One of NUMEC's most interesting products has just come off the drawing boards. Using plutonium-238 as a power source, NUMEC scientists and engineers will soon begin testing a radioisotope powered cardiac pacemaker.

NUMEC headquarters and some research and production activities are in Apollo, approximately 30 miles northeast of Pittsburgh. NUMEC was first housed in a building that was originally a shipping and storage building for a steel company. Now it is the heart of uranium processing operations. In facilities of over 65,000 square feet, nuclear products are produced.

In addition, the company has a 58 acre site five miles north of Apollo, where the Advanced Materials Center is located. In this complex NUMEC operates extensive manufacturing facilities and a full range of research, development, testing decontamination and waste disposal functions and services. The Advanced Materials Center is the world's first privately-owned, fully-integrated plant engaged in the production, research and development of plutonium as a fuel material.

Since 1960, NUMEC's main efforts have been devoted to this program, sponsored by the Atomic Energy Commission. The plant's original 20,000 square foot space has been nearly doubled since 1960 to permit the company to provide products and services on a commercial basis.

Plutonium is a man-made fissionable product formed from the uranium isotope U-238 in a nuclear reactor. Uranium-238 makes up 99.3 percent of natural uranium, but it does not produce energy through a chain reaction.

Plutonium, however, can produce energy through a chain reaction, and scientists are developing commercial methods for exploiting this.

In 1961, NUMEC erected a second plant at the Center, primarily for process development and manufacturing of ultra-high purity materials. There engineers developed a new production technique for manufacturing hafnium crystal bars weighing more than 300 pounds and measuring over 50 feet in length. Rolled into plate form, the hafnium is used for control rods for nuclear reactors.

In October, 1964, NUMEC became operating contractor for the Atomic Energy Commission's Niagara Falls Isotope Separation Facility. The plant is the only producer in the free world of BlO, a boron isotope. BlO is a valuable material for use in fabrication of reactor control rods because of its high neutron absorption capacity. The 110 employees working on the 340 acre site are processing BlO, and researching new uses for it and Bll, a by-product from the process.

NUMEC's accomplishments and capabilities are reflected in the international scope of the company's business. The diversity of NUMEC's customer roster includes every domestic nuclear reactor fabricator and numerous leading aerospace manufacturers, in addition to similar organizations abroad.

As a producer and consultant, NUMEC also serves such governmental agencies as the U.S. Department of Defense, NASA, Atomic Energy Commission; the Atomic Energy Commissions of France, Italy, Belgium, Sweden, Canada, the Netherlands and Japan; and leading international research institutes.

Currently, plant space totaling more than 150,000 square feet is devoted to manufacturing, research and development and general offices. In manufacturing, the company has produced hundreds of tons of nuclear fuel materials for major reactor projects, such as the Yankee Power Reactor in New England, the San Onofre in Southern California, and the SELNI Reactor in Italy.

NUMEC was one of the first firms to receive Atomic Energy Commission permits for processing uranium of all enrichments. NUMEC, however, does not own the plutonium and enriched uranium that go into its plants. Because of security arrangements, the Atomic Energy Commission owns all such material and required that detailed records be kept by all companies handling the materials. It sells only its services for processing the uranium into usable forms — not the uranium itself. The firm receives raw materials under special lease from the Atomic Energy Commission in the form of uranium hexafluoride which has been processed from the uranium ores.

Safety regulations govern every move made at the plant. For example, metal "birdcage" racks isolate uranium hexafluoride containers. If placed too close together, a "critical" condition results, creating extremely high temperatures. Signs and light signals indicate areas where radioactive materials are being processed or used.

Even a minute amount of plutonium may pose a radiation problem and many safeguards are used in the plant to avoid accidental exposures. Waste materials must be disposed of very carefully. They are usually packaged in sealed containers and sent outside the area for burial in locations approved by the Atomic Energy Commission.

This memorandum recommends obtaining subject's income tax returns from 1963 through 1967 for assistance in investigation of subject.

Subject is the head of Nuclear Materials and Equipment Corporation, Apollo, Pennsylvania, which processes In the past he has been in contact with Israeli Government officials, particularly those in the Israeli Atomic Energy Commission and, in fact, in 1965 formed a joint company in Israel with prominent officials of the Israeli Atomic Energy Commission for the purpose of irradiation of fruits and vegetables. At the request of the Attorney General we have instituted investigation to determine the nature and extent of subject's relationship with the Government of Israel with the purpose in mind of determining whether the subject is acting as an agent for the Israeli Government.

The Pittsburgh Office has requested that copies of subject's income tax returns for the years 1963 through 1967 be obtained for the purpose of additional investigative leads, financial status and data and any suspicious entries. A review of these income tax returns could be of benefit in ascertaining whether the subject is living beyond his means and possibly obtaining money from undisclosed sources.

Source stated that several years ago he read an article in the "Wall Street Journal," which related the fact that NUMEC had sustained unaccountable losses of nuclear material and that this disclosure did not come as a surprise Shapiro and the general security of NUMEC. that it was rather common knowledge among those individuals acquainted with the security aspect of nuclear work that Source explained security conditions at NUMEC were substandard advised that Shapiro set up NUMEC with very little capital. The original location of NUMEC was located in a building in Apollo, Pa., believed to have been purchased by Shapiro at a nominal cost from the Apollo Steel Company Source related that NUMEC was considered to be a boom to Apollo, which was a depressed area, inasmuch as it offered employment to the unemployed in the Apollo area. Source said that Shapiro was credited with being the engineering genuis behind the development and manufacturing of U235 at NUMEC. Source stated that NUMEC has expanded their operations during the past several years to include a large advanced nuclear plant approximately eight miles from the original nuclear plant in Apollo. Source went on to say, however, that he believed NUMEC has experienced financial difficulties, which in view of their apparent progress, is not quite understandable. Source said Shapiro was known to be interested in the stock market and reportedly has done quite well financially in stock investments. Shapiro is further reported to have many diversified financial investments and has maintained the reputation of placing his own interest before any company with which he is affiliated.

During the course of the interview with LOVETT concerning MORGAN, LOVETT volunteered the following information:

He advised that he, LOVETT, was in charge of the accountability of nuclear materials at NUMEC and that NUMEC had an inventory of approximately \$40,000,000 worth of nuclear materials. Approximately one half of these nuclear materials were maintained at the plant on North Warren Avenue in Apollo, Pa., across from the Administrative Office and the other half of these nuclear materials was maintained at a Plutonium Plant on Route 66, near Leechburg, Pa. LOVETT stated that he has been employed by NUMEC in the aforementioned capacity since approximately 1966 and had previously worked as an inspector for the Atomic Energy Commission and had inspected NUMEC once a year for approximately five years while in this position.

During the interview, Mr. LOVETT appeared to be very cooperative and to be a sincere, conscientious, and dedicated individual. It also appeared to SA HENDON that LOVETT had something further on his mind on which he expected to be questioned. However, nothing further was discussed with LOVETT other than that set forth above and background information regarding MORGAN.

Upon completion of the investigation by the Pittsburgh Office of JAMES EVERETT LOVETT, Pittsburgh will consider the advisability of contacting LOVETT away from his place of employment concerning the subject.

Investigation was instituted at the request of the Attorney General to establish the nature and extent of Zalman Mordecai Shapiro's relationship with the Government of Israel. This could be connected with, or in addition to, or as a result of, his association with Israeli officials and sympathizers in the United States.

On July 3, 1968, a source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised that to date, he has heard of no plans on the part of Shapiro to leave the United States for the purpose of visiting a foreign country. Source stated, however, that David Lowenthal, President of Raychord Corporation, and a long-time personal friend of Shapiro, left Pittsburgh, Pa., on or about July 2, 1968, for a trip to Europe and Israel. Source said he does not know the purpose of the trip nor the countries Lowenthal will visit while in Europe. Source stated that Lowenthal is expected to be gone for at least one week and possibly longer.

Source further advised that he has no knowledge of anyone accompanying Lowenthal on this trip to Europe. Source said he believed Lowenthal was to fly to New York City on the United Airlines, but had no knowledge of the airline he would utilize from New York to Europe.

source advised that he also is acquainted with some current and a few former employees of the Nuclear Materials and Equipment Corporation (NUMEC) and is aware of the general background regarding certain activities of this company.

Second source advised that NUMEC was formed during approximately 1956 for the purpose of manufacturing nuclear fuels and other materials used in commercial nuclear power reactors. Second source said that for approximately eight years the Atomic Energy Commission (AEC) has sponsored NUMEC in their production, research and development of plutonium as a fuel material.

Second source said that during 1966, AEC conducted an inspection at NUMEC in an effort to determine the causes for the loss of a quantity of enriched uranium which occurred at NUMEC over an apparent period of several years.

Second source advised that following this inspection at NUMEC, an article appeared in the Paris, France, edition of the 'New York Times," entitled, "YU. S. Plant Loses 100 Kilos of U235." This article was datelined Washington September 18, 1966, and was written by John W. Finney. Second source advised that the article in general stated that the AEC had recently discovered that one of its industrial contractors had lost more than 100 kilograms of enriched uranium and enough to fabricate half a dozen atomic

The article indicated that the loss of this bombs. enriched uranium indicated that possibly inadequate controls were being utilized in this country in connection with nuclear materials. It also brought up the question as to how Communist China had recently obtained enriched uranium for atomic tests.

aforementioned news article, the Congress of the United States held hearings in Washington, D. C. and AEC promoted several meetings in connection with the problems of safeguards and nuclear materials management. At approximately the same period of time, an Ad Advisory Panel was established and during March. 1967, disseminated a lengthy report on the safeguarding of special nuclear materials, which was followed by the formation of the Division of Nuclear Materials Safe-guard.

Following this action by AEC, Shapiro, in an apparent effort to improve the security conditions at NUMEC, hired James Everatt Lovett, who had been on AEC's Inspection Team at the time of their inspection of NUMEC.

Second source explained that it was also common knowledge among those individuals acquainted with the security aspect of nuclear work that security conditions at NUMEC have always been considered to be substandard.

Second source advised that concerning former employees at NUMEC, Frederick Forscher was Vice President at NUMEC during the period in which losses of enriched uranium were reported to have occurred. Forscher at that time, was in charge of metallurgical work at NUMEC and is currently the manager of Advanced Fuels, Atomic Power Divisions, Nuclear Field Divisions, Atomic Energy Division; Westinghouse Electric Corporation, Pittsburgh.

Second source advised that Floyd F Joyner was employed at NUMEC from approximately 1957 to 1964, at which time he understood Joyner was fired. He said that it was his understanding that Joyner was employed as the Accountability Representative at NUMEC and was bitter about his being fired from that company

Second source advised that he was not acquainted with the reason Joyner was fired by NUMEC.

During August, 1966, the Joint Committee on Atomic Energy, Congress of the United States, held a series of hearings on Atomic Energy Commission's proposed criteria for performing uranium enrichment The results of these hearings were published services. by the United States Government Printing Office, Washington, in 1966, in a report entitled, "Uranium Enrichment Services Criteria And Related Matters!" This report indicates that subject appeared as a witness before this committee on August 17, 1966. Subject presented his views to the committee concerning a proposed toll enrichment criteria and draft contracts and related steps then being taken by the Atomic Energy Commussion to implement the 1964 private ownership of Special Nuclear Materials Act. Subsequent to being asked several questions concerning enriching foreign uranium, subject was requested to submit answers in writing to seweral additional questions prepared by the committee. | By letter dated September 26, 1986, subject furnished the committee these answers which included the following question and answer by subject:

- "Q. (a) Do you believe that AFC's licensees are currently maintaining records and other controls pertaining to special nuclear material which are adequate for the purpose of safeguarding against diversion of such material to unauthorized uses?
- (b) Do you think substantial improvements are needed in the AFC's regulations and procedures for safeguarding against diversion of special nuclear material in the hands of licensees?
- (c) Do you think the AFC should specify (l) the material accountability and (2) the physical security procedures to be followed by AFC's licensees to safeguard against diversion?
- (d) What are your views concerning the recently announced proposed changes in its regulations concerning safeguarding against diversion?
- "A. We believe that, by and large, the records and other controls maintained by ABC's licensees are, and have been, effective in safeguarding


"against the diversion of special nuclear material to unauthorized purposes.

"To the extent that the present system can be improved by modifications in regulations and procedures, we believe that the changes recently proposed by the AEC are clearly a step in the right direction. These changes would, in general, bring all special nuclear material, regardless of ownership status, under a system of control very similar to that which now governs material held on a station or contract basis. We believe these requirements are entirely in order and that they will not impose a serious financial or other burden on fuel suppliers.

"We believe that it would be helpful
if the AEC would specify some minimum standards
for acceptable materials accountability and
physical security procedures. Such standards
would be useful as guidelines for the development
of detailed accountability and security procedures
by individual companies."



During November, 1968, the Security Office, AEC, Washington, D. C., made available a copy of a letter dated October 8, 1968, from subject to Dr. Glenn T. Seaborg, Chairman, United States Atomic Energy Commission, Washington, D. C., which reads as follows:

"Dear Dr. Seaborg:

"NUMEC (Nuclear Materials and Equipment Corporation) has been receiving a number of requests from potential domestic and foreign customers to furnish them with microwatt and milliwatt thermolelectric generators powered by Pu-238. The number of these inquiries has increased since the official A.E.C. announcement indicating the availability of Pu-238 for commercial applications.

"However, despite this announcement, we have found it impossible to make any firm proposals for the supply of these units because we have not been able to get definitive answers to questions put to the A.E.C. regarding availability of the material in metallic form, purity, encaposulation cost, schedule and possible restrictions on use for domestic and foreign applications. More specifically, we must know:


- "1. Whether the material will be equally available for foreign applications as well as domestic applications. If this is not the case, what the specific restrictions are on foreign sales.
- "2. Whether there are any restrictions on the amount of Pu-238 in any particular device, assuming it can be licensed.
- "3. Whether any special criteria are to be employed in the design of the capsule and the device in which the capsule is located from the standpoint of licensing for domestic or foreign use.
- "4. What the minimum purity of the oxide will be.
- "5. Whether the material will be made a vailable as metal as well as oxide since the oxide is unfit for many applications. Also, what will the minimum purity specifications and price on the metal be if it is supplied.
- "6. What maximum tolerance can be expected on the specified thermal and radiation output.

- "8. Whether the customer will be expected to supply the capsule parts or whether the A.E.C. will want to supply them.
- "9. What the basis will be for establishment of delivery schedules and whether these can be considered firm for quotation to potential customers.

"We urgently request that these matters be resolved as quickly as possible so that we can make definitive replies to our potential customers as well as determine whether we should continue our own private development of devices for commercial sale. It would be especially helpful we could obtain immediate resolution of Items 1, 5, 7, and 9."

During December, 1968, the Security Office, AEC, Washington, D. C., made available a copy of a letter dated November 20, 1968, from Glenn T. Seaborg, Chairman, United States Atomic Energy Commission, Washington, D. C., to subject, which reads as follows:

"Dear Zal:

"This is in response to your letter of October 8, 1968, containing various questions pertaining plutonium 238 for commercial applications. I am heartened by the increasing interest in the use of plutonium 238 as mentioned in your letter, and I want to be of assistance in any way I can in the encouragement of the beneficial use of this isotope and other Commission products. In the interest of clarity and to be sure I have responded to all your questions, I am answering the letter in the format as you sent it to me.

"In answer to your first question, the 500 grams of plutonium 238 made available in April 1968 may be used for foreign applications as well as domestic applications. Overseas distribution in the free world is made on a non-discriminatory basis by (1) direct purchase through the U. S. Atomic Energy Commission by means of a formal request from the overseas customer to the Division of International Affairs, U.S. Atomic Energy Commission, Washington, D.C., or (2) by direct purchase from any private source, subject to applicable rules and regulations of the Atomic Energy Commission for the export of special nuclear materials.

"With regard to your second question, and in the context of your request, i.e., plutonium 238 for microwatt and milliwatt thermoelectric generators, there are no restrictions on the amount of plutonium 238 in a single device, assuming it can be licensed. Criticality is the only concern in terms of the amount of plutonium 238 that can be used in any particular device.

"The answer to your third question is that from the standpoint of licensing for domestic or foreign use, there are no special criteria to be employed in the design of the capsule and the device which the capsule is located.

"Concerning your questions 4., part of 5., and 6., we have enclosed a very recent compilation of plutonium 238 data which has been accumulated by the Mound Laboratory over a number of years. While there is no material specifications, as such, for the commercially available plutonium oxide, these data should be helpful in answering your questions concerning the characteristics of the isotope in oxide, metal and other forms on the basis of average values. The heat source specification which was developed for the cardiac pacemaker and in which you are currently participating, may be considered typical of the metal which the AEC could supply.

"With regard to the remainder of question 5., and questions 7., 8., and 9., conversion from the exide to other forms, such as the metal, and encapsulation services are available through AEC laboratories at additional cost but only if they are not available Members of our staff have from private industry. had discussions with the following companies which have indicated some capabilities in these areas: Atomics International, Donald W. Douglas Laboratory, General Nuclear Incorporated, Monsanto Research Corporation, and the Vallecitos Atomic Laboratory of the General Electric Company. As stated by Dr. Herman M. Roth, Director, Laboratory University Division, Oak Ridge Operations Office, in his letter dated October 29, 1968, to Mr. C. H. Whitmire of your company, if these or other commercial sources are not responsive to your needs, the work you wish to have done can be requested through the Isotopes Sales Department of the Oak Ridge National Laboratory. The criteria for the AEC performing this work are essentially those which Dr. Roth enumerated. Namely, your request should be accompanied by a list of the commercial firms you have contacted, their reasons and yours for not providing the services, and any other information which would be useful in evaluating your request. The description of the work you wish to have done should include the quantity of isotope fuel, the fuel form, thermal wattage per source, capsule design, encapsulating materials, and total number of heat sources to be fabricated. Only after this information has been received can the costs of your work, which would be based on full cost recovery, be established. At that time, delivery schedules could be established on a non-interfering basis and a determination made as to whether NUMEC or the AEC laboratory would supply capsule parts.



Description

The design of the NUMEC Neutron-Pac® offers unique operating versatility. A brief description of the various operational arrangements is presented

1. Central Source Position with Annular Experiments

Arrangement 1 shows upper and lower polyethylene plugs in the vertical experimental well and a source or sources in the central irradiation position. Sample containers are in the three annular irradiation positions which are located 120° apart in the region of maximum thermal flux. This arrangement enables three different or similar experiments to be conducted simultaneously.

2. Annular Source Position with Central Experiment

Thermal neutron flux rises to a maximum and then decreases as a function of distance from a fast neutron source due to the combined effects of geometry and moderation. The Neutron-Pac® takes advantage of this phenomenon achieving higher flux when three sources are placed in the annular positions and a single experiment is performed in the central irradiation position as shown in Arrangement 2.

3. Beam Experiments in Vertical Position

Any of the three vertical irradiation positions may be used as a vertical beam port for absorptimetry experiments and analysis or for neutron radiography as shown in Arrangement 3. A fast neutron beam can be obtained by lining any irradiation position with a cadmium sleeve.

4. Small Animal Irradiators

For radiation exposure of small animals, a cage may be placed on the lower polyethylene plug.

> Source Samples

The upper plug provides shielding while the source handling rod holes provide ventilation, as shown in Arrangement 4.

5. Experiment Tank

a. Liquid with Dry Source

By replacing the upper polyethylene plug with the liquid irradiation tank as shown in Arrangement 5, the entire 8" diameter by 14" high cylindrical volume is available for either fast or slow neutron experimentation depending on whether an unlined or cadmium-lined tank is used. For these experiments, the sources are placed at the top of the lower polyethylene plug. The irradiation in this tank may be performed in air or under any liquid, in a system with infinite incremental geometric variables, or the tank may be used to produce radioisotopes in large volumes of solutions.

b. Liquid with Wet Sources




If a fast neutron beam is desired, a cadmium radial beam shield is inserted in the beam port to absorb most of the thermal neutrons in the beam.

Specifications

Container: The basic structure of the Neutron-Pac® is a 22" diameter by 35" high stainless steel container with a coved experiment tray, a vertical experimental well, a hinged cover with lock and key and optional beam ports with lock and key. The container is mounted on ball bearing casters for easy mobility. Design considerations enable sources and port shields to be secured so that the Neutron-Pac® can be safely left unattended during irradiation periods.

Shielding: A special microcrystalline wax, having a melting point of 157°F and a flash point of 550°F, is carefully cast between the vertical experiment well and the outer container to provide an integral uniform shield for the operator. With the source in the central position, a surface dose rate of less than 1 mrem. per hour per curie of Pu-Be and Am-Be source occurs.

Vertical Irradiation Well: An 8" diameter by 21" high vertical irradiation well holds the 5" lower and 16" upper polyethylene irradiation plugs which provide four fixed irradiation positions of 13%" diameter.

Placing a 12.5 liter stainless steel irradiation tank in the vertical irradiation well provides containment for solutions to be irradiated or allows infinitely variable geometry. An optional cadmiumlined liquid irradiation tank is available when fast neutron interaction is desired.

When the animal cage is placed on the lower polyethylene irradiation plug, the upper plug provides shielding for the operator and ventilation for animals. A stainless steel drain and valve are provided in the bottom of the well to facilitate cleaning or draining.

Sample Shield and Removal Tool: Each of three 17½" long sample shield and removal tools locks onto one of the three sample containers by means of a "J" slot. These containers are then usable to position foils, liquid irradiation bottles or materials for irradiation in any of the four fixed vertical irradiation positions. These tools shield the source when the annular array is used.

Source Lifting Tool: A 30" source lifting tool with a permanent magnet is provided for convenient and safe moving of sources and magnetic polyethylene plugs. The dose 30" from an Am-Be or Pu-Be neutron source is 3.5 mr/hr/ curie; thus an exposure of 30 curie hours per week at 30" may be tolerated before reaching the U. S. A.E.C. maximum permissible dose of 100 mr/week.

Foils: A set of activation foils is provided which consists of 10 indium foils, 20 cadmium foils, one 10k gold foil and one 18k gold foil. Calibrated foils are also available.

Beam Port: Up to four aluminum-clad beam ports can be provided. Each beam port has a 2" diameter by 11" long semi-cylindrical sample holder (with lock and key) which can be used with moderator spacers and foils to obtain flux profiles.

Source Magnetic Caps: Three source magnetic caps of 430 stainless steel are attached to the standard NUMEC Pu Be neutron source or the Type A NUMEC Am-Be neutron source.

Spacers: Five magnetic and twelve 3/8" diameter plexiglass spacers are included. Others are available as an extra.







On January 17, 1969, LRL, advised that for a period of about two and one-half years beginning four years earlier, he had been directly involved with the contract between LRL and NUMEC under which the firm processed nuclear material. During this time, he had occasion to meet with Shapiro at LRL on two or three occasions and met him at his company on a number of octasions.

Certain aspects of the performance of NUMEC under the contract had been unsatisfactory, particularly in the area of health standards expected of the firm in handling toxic materials, regarding routine handling and safeguarding of classified information furnished the company and regarding unexplained loss of nuclear material.

Under the contract, NUMEC was furnished highly sensitive information in the secret classification concerning operations at LRL. had no reason to think that such information had ever been compromised in any manner the actions of anyone in the firm. The current Polk's City Directory for Bethesda, Maryland, lists ROBERT LOWENSTEIN (ROLLIE H.), 6601 Tulip Hill Terrace, Assistant Director of Regulations, Atomic Energy Commission (AEC).

On 11/1/68, CLEMENT PALLAZZOLO, Security Officer, AEC, Germantown, Maryland, advised LOWENSTEIN terminated employment at AEC in August, 1965 and is reportedly self employed as a lawyer in WDC. (It is noted that a review of the current C & P Telephone Company Directory for the Metropolitan-WDC area at this time reflected a listing for ROBERT LOWENSTEIN, Lawyer, 1100 Connecticut Avenue, N.W., WDC, telephone number 296 - 7585).

PALLAZZOLO advised that a review of LOWENSTEIN'S AEC personnel file reflects that he was appointed an attorney for AEC in 1952. A re-investigation in 1957 was for a similar position. A 1962 re-investigation reflected he was appointed as a Director in the Division of Licensing and Regulation and in 1964, he was appointed Assistant Director for Regulation. He terminated his employment at AEC in August, 1965 but maintained his AEC Q Clearance as a consultant to AEC. He is still on the rolls as a consultant but PALLAZZOLO does not believe he is active at this time since the last note in his file stating AEC wasusing him as a consultant was for the period September, 1965 - June, 1966.

PALLAZZOLO described the AEC Q Access Clearance as having access to any classification of information on a need to know basis. In the course of LOWENSTEIN's employment from 1952 to 1965, and as a consultant, he would undoubtedly have had access to classified information but to determine the degree of sensitivity, records of the AEC Security Library would have to be reviewed and his supervisors would have to be interviewed for their recollections as to what work he was involved in.

LOWENSTEIN signed an AEC Loyalty Oath stating he is not a member of the Communist Party or any other subversive organization advocating the overthrow of the U.S. Government.

A 1952 AEC memorandum in LOWENSTEIN's file reflects that he advised that he is a member of the American Veterans Committee for Democratic Action. An addendum to this note stated that this organization is alleged to be communist infiltrated.

It is noted that LOWENSTEIN's file reflects numerous minor security violations, i.e. leaving safe open, leaving classified papers on his desk, etc., which would indicate a laxness concerning the aspect of security. His file also includes extensive chronological background which is not being set out at this time for the sake of brevity.



We have kept the Atomic Energy Commission the Department of State, and the Internal Security Division of the Department advised on a continuing basis of the facts developed through our investigation. We have considered interviewing Shapiro concerning his relationship with Israeli officials. It is not believed, however, that such an interview would be productive and it is considered most unlikely that Shapiro would make any pertinent admissions.

This Bureau plans to continue intensive investigation regarding the various Israeli representatives in the United States with whom Shapiro has been in contact as well as other individuals in this country who have been reported to be cooperating with Shapiro in securing information of value to the Israeli Government. Copies of reports in these cases will continue to be furnished to the Internal Security Division of the Department.

She related that everyone in Israel knows ZALMAN SHAPIRO 7 PG T-3 advised on December 15, 1938, that on that date SHAPIRO indicated to JOSEPH SWARTZ, attorney and personal friend, that he is seriously considering the possibility of settling, (U)Israel within the next five years. He made this comment, according to DG T-3, as a result of his recent trip to that country, having returned from Israel on December 12, 1968. With regard to this move, SHAPTRO indicated he is tot positive of the type of work he would pursue should he migrate to Israel. Source indicated that SHAPIRO said he had discussed several $\{U\}$ business opportunities with people in Israel, but he had reached no conclusion in this regard. . 47 -

This source has pointed out that Raychord Corporation, a steel fabricating firm, occupied the semo building with Messe prior to the time NUMBEC moved to its new location on the outskirts of Apollo. This source also pointed out that LOWENTEAL is also an officer of Apollo Industries, and this company was instrumental in establishing KULEC through the investment of a substantial amount of money when NUMBC was formed.

(M)(P) pg T-7, in addition to the information furnished above, has advised that LOWENTHAL her traveled to Israel frequently during the period PG T-7 has been acquainted with him, which is over three years. Same source has pointed out that LOWERTHAL has been active in the United Jewish Appdal (UJA), and is one of its principal officers in the United States.


